A RESOLUTION

1 2	Commemorating April 18, 2017, as "Doolittle Raiders Remembrance Day" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, April 18, 2017, marks the 75th anniversary of the
4	Doolittle Raid, the first United States air attack on the main
5	island of Japan after the attack on Pearl Harbor; and
6	WHEREAS, The raid is considered to have served as an enormous
7	boost to American morale in the Pacific following the
8	devastation from the Pearl Harbor attack and subsequent defeats
9	in the Pacific that had overwhelmed the spirit of the American
10	people and the United States Navy; and
11	WHEREAS, Lieutenant Colonel James H. "Jimmy" Doolittle led 16
12	B-25 bombers, launching off the aircraft carrier U.S.S. Hornet
13	in a daring attack on the home island of Japan, including Tokyo;
14	and
15	WHEREAS, The mission was known to be both dangerous and one

of the first attempts to launch bombers from the deck of an
aircraft carrier; and

3 WHEREAS, Of the 80 servicepersons who conducted the raid, 4 later to be referred to as the Doolittle Raiders, 7 were killed 5 or fatally injured in the attack, 3 were executed by the 6 Japanese and 1 died from starvation as prisoners of war and four 7 others were tortured as prisoners of war until their release in 8 1945; and

9 WHEREAS, Most of the surviving Doolittle Raiders continued to 10 serve their country during the remainder of the war, resulting 11 in 10 men being killed in action and 4 men being shot down and 12 interned as German prisoners of war; and

13 WHEREAS, All of the Doolittle Raiders received the 14 Distinguished Flying Cross, two received the Silver Star, and 15 Lt. Col. Doolittle was awarded the Medal of Honor for leading 16 the mission; and

WHEREAS, The attack was a tremendous boost to American morale and set the stage for future American victories such as the Battle of Midway; therefore be it

20 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives commemorate April 21 18, 2017, as "Doolittle Raiders Remembrance Day" in

22 Pennsylvania; and be it further

23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage local 24 governments and the communities throughout this Commonwealth to 25 conduct appropriate "Doolittle Raiders Remembrance Day" 26 observances to ensure that the many sacrifices of that day are 27 not forgotten.
