## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating January 23, 2019, as "Maternal Health Awareness Day"
- in Pennsylvania to recognize all the women who die from
- complications of pregnancy or childbirth.
- 4 WHEREAS, Women who die during pregnancy, or within one year
- 5 after giving birth, from any cause related to or aggravated by
- 6 the pregnancy are considered to have died a pregnancy-related
- 7 death; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The number of pregnancy-related deaths in the United
- 9 States has continued to rise, despite recent advances in medical
- 10 science and technology; and
- 11 WHEREAS, In 1986, the Federal Centers for Disease Control and
- 12 Prevention implemented a Pregnancy Mortality Surveillance System
- 13 to obtain information about the frequency and causes of
- 14 pregnancy-related death in the United States; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Despite declines in the maternal mortality rate in
- 16 other parts of the world, the data collected under the Pregnancy

- 1 Mortality Surveillance System has shown a steady increase in the
- 2 maternal mortality rate in the United States, from a low of 7.2
- 3 deaths per 100,000 live births in 1987 to 15.9, 17.3 and 18
- 4 deaths per 100,000 in 2012, 2013 and 2014, respectively; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The Pregnancy Mortality Surveillance System
- 6 indicates that the rate of pregnancy-related deaths varies by
- 7 race, ethnicity and age, with African-American women having the
- 8 highest mortality rate at 40 deaths per every 100,000 live
- 9 births; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The most recent data available on the maternal
- 11 mortality rate in Pennsylvania indicates that from 2012 to 2016,
- 12 there was an increase in maternal deaths with 11.4 deaths per
- 13 100,000 live births; and
- 14 WHEREAS, For African-American women in Pennsylvania, the
- 15 maternal mortality rate was 27.2 deaths per 100,000 live births;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
- 18 recommends maternal deaths be investigated through state-based
- 19 reviews to identify the causes of pregnancy-related deaths and
- 20 recommend ways to decrease maternal death rates; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
- 22 Pennsylvania approved and the Governor signed act 24 of 2018,
- 23 known as the Maternal Mortality Review Act, establishing the
- 24 multidisciplinary Maternal Mortality Review Committee, as a
- 25 first step to address the serious issue of increasing maternal
- 26 mortality across the Commonwealth; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The committee is tasked with examining pregnancy-
- 28 related deaths, developing prevention recommendations and
- 29 increasing public and professional awareness of the incidence of
- 30 pregnancy-related deaths and strategies to prevent maternal

- 1 deaths in this Commonwealth; and
- 2 WHEREAS, In order to improve public and professional
- 3 awareness and promote the various promising initiatives to
- 4 reduce the maternal mortality rate, it is both reasonable and
- 5 appropriate to designate a day as "Maternal Health Awareness
- 6 Day" in this Commonwealth and invite community members and
- 7 health care professionals to participate in appropriate
- 8 activities relating to maternal health, safety and mortality;
- 9 therefore be it
- 10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate January
- 11 23, 2019, as "Maternal Health Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania to
- 12 recognize all the women who die from complications of pregnancy
- 13 or childbirth.
