INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35, APRIL 27, 2015

A RESOLUTION

Designating April 28, 2015, as "Workers' Memorial Day" in 1 Pennsylvania in memory of workers killed, injured and 2 disabled in the workplace and in recognition of the efforts 3 4 of the Greater Wilkes-Barre Labor Council. 5 WHEREAS, Every year in America, a great number of workers are killed as a result of workplace injuries and occupational 6 7 diseases; and 8 WHEREAS, The Federal Bureau of Labor and Statistics has reported that in 2013, more than 4,405 workers suffered fatal 9 10 injuries in the workplace and more than 3 million individuals 11 suffered nonfatal work-related injuries and illnesses; and 12 WHEREAS, In 2013, 178 Pennsylvania workers lost their lives 13 due to fatal accidents in the workplace; and 14 WHEREAS, While the official "National Workers' Memorial Day" 15 is celebrated annually on April 28, the Greater Wilkes-Barre Labor Council and other concerned residents are determined to 16

prevent these tragedies with a local observation of "National
Workers' Memorial Day" on April 23, 2015, as a day to remember
these victims of workplace injuries; and

WHEREAS, Through the local observance of this day, the Greater Wilkes-Barre Labor Council renews its efforts to seek stronger safety and health protections, better standards and enforcement and fair and just compensation, and also rededicates itself to improving the health and safety of every American workplace; therefore be it

10 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate April 11 28, 2015, as "Workers' Memorial Day" in Pennsylvania in memory 12 of workers killed, injured and disabled in the workplace and in 13 recognition of the efforts of the Greater Wilkes-Barre Labor 14 Council and its tenth annual local "Workers' Memorial Day" 15 program and candlelight vigil service.
