A RESOLUTION

- Designating June 19, 2015, as "World Sickle Cell Day" in Pennsylvania.
- WHEREAS, Each year in the United States, approximately 2,000
- 4 infants are born with sickle cell disease; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Sickle cell disease is a blood disorder that affects
- 6 red blood cells; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Red blood cells which are normally round and soft
- 8 become sickle-shaped, making it difficult for these cells to
- 9 pass through small blood vessels; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Sickle cell disease occurs when a child inherits two
- 11 sickle hemoglobin genes, one from each parent; and
- 12 WHEREAS, There is no known universal cure for sickle cell
- 13 disease; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The complications from this serious disease can be
- 15 fatal, making the primary goal of health care providers to

- 1 prevent complications such as sickle cell pain crisis; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Children with sickle cell disease require ongoing
- 3 medical attention and typically require hospitalization on an
- 4 intermittent, sometimes ongoing basis; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Hospitalizations and home recovery result in a
- 6 school-age child missing an average of one month of school per
- 7 year, which creates special challenges for the children, their
- 8 parents, educators and social workers; and
- 9 WHEREAS, If hospitalization occurs, this can be a difficult
- 10 time for children and their families, often causing economic
- 11 hardship that requires financial support for the families; and
- 12 WHEREAS, In the United States, sickle cell disease is most
- 13 common in African Americans, occurring in 1 in every 500 births
- 14 in this ethnic group, while also occurring in 1 in every 36,000
- 15 Hispanic-American births, and it also affects those of Indian,
- 16 Mediterranean and southern European descent; and
- WHEREAS, Sickle cell disease affects 90,000 to 100,000 people
- 18 in the United States and millions worldwide; and
- 19 WHEREAS, In 2009, the World Health Organization designated
- 20 June 19 as "World Sickle Cell Day"; therefore be it
- 21 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate June
- 22 19, 2015, as "World Sickle Cell Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it
