INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35, JUNE 24, 2013

A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of September 2013 as "Childhood Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania, honoring those young people 2 who have lost their lives to childhood cancer, expressing 3 gratitude to the doctors and nurses who provide special care
- to patients and families affected by childhood cancer, and 5 encouraging all citizens to join the fight against childhood 6
 - cancer in this Commonwealth.
- 8 WHEREAS, Childhood cancers make up less than 1% of all
- cancers diagnosed each year and childhood cancer rates have been
- 10 rising slightly for the past few decades; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Childhood cancer is the second leading cause of
- death in children under the age of 15, exceeded only by
- 13 accidents and about 1,310 children are expected to die of cancer
- 14 in 2013; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that about

- 1 11,630 children in the United States under the age of 15 will be
- 2 diagnosed with cancer in 2013; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The potential years of life lost to childhood cancer
- 4 and the potential years of life saved by treatment exceed all
- 5 other cancers with the exception of breast cancer; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Most children cannot be treated at a local hospital,
- 7 and families must face the disruption of moving for treatment at
- 8 a regional cancer center; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Because of major treatment advances in recent
- 10 decades, more than 80% of children with cancer now survive 5
- 11 years or more; and
- 12 WHEREAS, This is a huge increase since the mid-1970s, when
- 13 the 5-year survival rate was less than 60%; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Survival rates vary depending on the type of cancer
- 15 and other factors; and
- 16 WHEREAS, There is significant progress that still must be
- 17 made with regard to childhood cancer treatment, because there
- 18 are many types of childhood cancer, and some varieties with
- 19 lower survival rates are still very difficult to treat; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is a leader in the fight against and
- 21 treatment of childhood cancer with six Children's Oncology Group
- 22 hospitals, St. Christopher's Hospital for Children, The
- 23 Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, Geisinger Medical Center,
- 24 Lehigh Valley Hospital Muhlenburg, Hershey Medical Center and
- 25 Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Two of only ten institutions in the Pediatric Brain
- 27 Tumor Consortium are in Pennsylvania, The Children's Hospital of
- 28 Philadelphia and Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh, and Penn
- 29 State Hershey Children's Hospital is one of only 11 institutions
- 30 nationwide in the Pediatric Oncology Experimental Therapeutic

- 1 Consortium; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 3 month of September 2013 as "Childhood Cancer Awareness Month" in
- 4 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor those young
- 6 people who have lost their lives to childhood cancer, express
- 7 gratitude to the doctors and nurses who provide special care to
- 8 patients and families affected by childhood cancer, and
- 9 encourage all citizens to join the fight against childhood
- 10 cancer in this Commonwealth.
