A RESOLUTION

Amending House Rule 66 (a), further providing for vote by designation. 2 3 RESOLVED, That House Rule 66 (a) be amended to read: RULE 66 (a) 4 5 Vote by Designation 6 A member who is not present in the Hall of the House may designate either the Majority or Minority Whip to cast the member's vote on any question. A member who is incarcerated or for whom an active warrant has been issued for the member's arrest may not cast a vote under this rule. 10 If a designated Whip is on leave, that designated Whip may 11 12 appoint another member to cast all votes designated to that 13 Whip. A designation, including commencement date, shall be 14 accomplished by filing an attestation with the Chief Clerk which 15 identifies either the Majority or Minority Whip as the member's 16

- 1 designee when the member will not be present in the Hall of the
- 2 House.
- 3 A member may revoke the member's designation by notifying the
- 4 Chief Clerk in writing of the revocation.
- 5 A member voting by designation shall be counted in
- 6 determining whether a quorum is present.
- 7 A designation shall be effective until the designation is
- 8 revoked.
- 9 At any voting meeting of a committee of the House of
- 10 Representatives, a member of the committee who is not present
- 11 may designate the chair or minority chair to cast the member's
- 12 vote on any question.
- 13 The designation shall be accomplished by filing an
- 14 attestation with the chair or minority chair which affirms that
- 15 the member will not be present at the voting meeting.
- 16 A member voting by designation shall be counted in
- 17 determining whether a quorum is present.
- 18 The Chief Clerk shall implement video conferencing or similar
- 19 remote participation technology to allow members voting by
- 20 designation on the House Floor or at any voting meeting of a
- 21 standing committee of the House of Representatives to engage in
- 22 simultaneous, interactive participation.
- 23 A voting meeting of a standing committee of the House of
- 24 Representatives shall be held in a committee room utilizing
- 25 video conferencing or similar remote participation technology
- 26 unless such a room is not available. The video conferencing or
- 27 similar remote participation technology must safeguard the
- 28 integrity of the legislative process and must make a live stream
- 29 of a voting meeting of a standing committee available to the
- 30 public.
