A RESOLUTION

1 2	Amending the General Operating Rules of the House of Representatives, providing for member incapacity inquiries.
3	RESOLVED, That General Operating Rules of the House of
4	Representatives be amended by adding a rule to read:
5	<u>RULE 46 (a)</u>
6	<u>Committee on Rules Subcommittee</u>
7	Incapacity Inquiries
8	The Committee on Rules Subcommittee shall consist of the
9	Speaker, Majority Leader, Majority Caucus Chair, Minority Leader
10	and Minority Caucus Chair. The Majority Leader shall serve as
11	the chair and the Minority Leader shall serve as the vice chair.
12	An incapacity inquiry may be initiated by the Floor Leader of
13	the party of the subject member by filing a confidential request
14	for an incapacity inquiry before the subcommittee. A
15	confidential request for an incapacity inquiry shall be filed
16	with the Floor Leader of the opposite party and shall include
17	the following information:
18	(1) The name of the House member for whom an incapacity

1	inquiry is sought.
2	(2) The reason for the request for an incapacity inquiry.
3	(3) Any additional information that the respective Floor
4	Leader believes would be helpful and appropriate to share
5	regarding the request.
6	Following the filing of a request for an incapacity inquiry,
7	the subcommittee shall conduct an incapacity inquiry to
8	<u>determine whether a subject member suffers from a temporary or</u>
9	permanent impairment, physical or mental, rendering the subject
10	member unable to discharge the duties of office, including
11	substance abuse or impairment of cognitive abilities that
12	renders the subject member unable to perform the duties or
13	functions of office.
14	The chair of the subcommittee, after consultation with the
15	vice chair, shall determine a date for an initial confidential
16	meeting of the subcommittee. The initial meeting shall be held
17	within 30 days following receipt of a request. The chair of the
18	subcommittee shall notify all members at least 24 hours in
19	advance of the date, time and place of all meetings regarding an
20	incapacity inquiry unless the chair and vice chair agree the
21	meeting should be held earlier under the circumstances. If the
22	subcommittee determines it will proceed with an incapacity
23	inquiry, the subcommittee shall promptly provide notice of the
24	inquiry to the subject member. The subject member may
25	participate in the inquiry and may be represented by counsel.
26	The subcommittee may take or direct whatever action it deems
27	necessary or proper to determine incapacity. The subject member
28	may furnish written consent to the release of information and
29	records relating to the incapacity if requested by the
30	subcommittee. The subcommittee may issue subpoenas for documents

1	or direct examination of witnesses as part of an incapacity	
2	inquiry by a majority vote of the subcommittee. Notwithstanding	
3	a provision of any other rule of the House, subpoenas issued	
4	under this rule shall be in the name of the subcommittee, shall	
5	be signed by the chair of the subcommittee and shall be attested	
6	by another member of the subcommittee who voted in favor of	
7	authorizing the subpoena. A subpoena issued by the subcommittee	
8	may be served upon any person and shall have the force and	
9	effect of a subpoena issued out of the courts of this	
10	Commonwealth. Subpoenas shall be served by any person designated	
11	by the subcommittee when directed to do so by the subcommittee.	
12	Each subpoena shall be addressed to the witness and shall state	
13	that such proceeding is before the Committee on Rules	
14	Subcommittee for which the witness is required to attend at a	
15	specified time and place, or to produce books, papers, records,	
16	accounts, reports, documents and data and information produced	
17	and stored by any electronic data processing system, or both, as	
18	the subcommittee may also require. Mileage and witness fees	
19	shall be paid by the House to such witness in an amount	
20	prescribed by law. Unless addressed to and served on the subject	
21	member of an incapacity inquiry, a copy of a subpoena issued by	
22	the subcommittee shall be provided to the subject member and the	
23	subject member's counsel, if applicable. A recipient of a	
24	subpoena issued by the subcommittee may object to the subpoena	
25	by serving notice of such objection on the signatory to the	
26	subpoena and the subcommittee. The subcommittee may modify the	
27	subpoena if it finds the subpoena to be overly broad or without	
28	proper purpose. The chair and vice chair of the subcommittee	
29	shall have the power to administer oaths and affirmations to	
30	witnesses appearing before the subcommittee. The subcommittee

16 If the subject member enters a treatment program during the	_
17 incapacity inquiry, the subcommittee may defer the incapacity	
18 inquiry for a reasonable period of time to permit the completi	<u>on</u> _
19 of the program, provided the subject member:	
20 (1) actively participates in the treatment program;	
21 (2) consents in writing to the release of information and	
22 records relating to the subject member's participation in the	
23 program; and	
24 (3) if determined necessary by the subcommittee, agrees to	<u>a</u>
25 voluntary suspension of some or all of the subject member's	
26 <u>duties or functions of office.</u>	
27 If the subject member completes the treatment program, the	
28 <u>subcommittee may:</u>	
29 (1) dismiss the incapacity inquiry; or	
30 (2) continue the incapacity inquiry pending a reevaluation	_

1	after a period of time specified by the subcommittee.	
2	If a majority of the members of the subcommittee determines	
3	that the subject member is incapacitated and unable to perform	
4	the duties or functions of office, the subcommittee may make one	
5	or more of the following recommendations to the House, as	
6	appropriate based on the circumstances, the nature of the	
7	incapacity and the probable length of the period of incapacity:	
8	(1) The denial or limitation of any right, power or	
9	privilege of the subject member granted by Rules of the House	
10	and not contrary to the Constitution of Pennsylvania.	
11	(2) Suspension of the subject member with or without pay.	
12	(3) Expulsion of the subject member from the House.	
13	Nothing in this rule shall impact the ability of the House,	
14	Speaker or Caucus leaders from placing limitations on the	
15	subject member that are within their authority.	
16	The subcommittee shall provide a written report of its	
17	findings and recommendations, if any, to the subject member and	
18	shall simultaneously submit a copy of the same to the House.	
19	Only findings and recommendations agreed to by a majority of the	
20	subcommittee shall be included in the report.	
21	A subject member who has been determined to be incapacitated	
22	by the House and subject to either:	
23	(1) the denial or limitation of any right, power or	
24	privilege granted by the Rules of the House; or	
25	(2) suspension with or without pay	
26	may petition the subcommittee for reconsideration based on the	
27	subject member's completion of a treatment program related to	
28	incapacity.	
29	A member of the subcommittee who is the subject member of the	
30	inquiry may not participate in the inquiry as a member of the

- 2 into the subject member, shall be replaced on the subcommittee
- 3 with another member of leadership from the same party as the

4 member removed who shall be selected by the Floor Leader of the

- 6 <u>Members of the Committee on Rules Subcommittee shall receive</u>
- 7 training on the ethical responsibilities regarding the
- 8 initiation and handling of an incapacity inquiry.
