A RESOLUTION

- Designating the month of October 2017 as "Sudden Cardiac Arrest Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, According to the Sudden Cardiac Arrest Foundation,
- 4 sudden cardiac arrest is a leading cause of death in the United
- 5 States, accounting for an estimated 360,000 deaths each year;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, Sudden cardiac arrest is a condition in which the
- 8 heart unexpectedly ceases to function due to ventricular
- 9 fibrillation, an irregular and rapid quivering of the heart's
- 10 lower pumping chambers; and
- 11 WHEREAS, When this occurs, blood stops flowing to the brain
- 12 and other vital organs, causing loss of consciousness or
- 13 seizure-like activity in seconds; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Anyone can experience sudden cardiac arrest,
- 15 including infants, high school athletes and individuals 30 years

- 1 of age or older who have no sign of heart disease; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Sudden cardiac arrest is extremely deadly, with the
- 3 National Heart, Lung and Blood Institute giving the disease a
- 4 mortality rate of approximately 95%; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The normal rhythm of the heart can only be restored
- 6 with defibrillation, an electrical shock that is safely
- 7 delivered to the chest by an automated external defibrillator
- 8 (AED); and
- 9 WHEREAS, If not treated within minutes, sudden cardiac arrest
- 10 results in death; and
- 11 WHEREAS, For every minute that passes without defibrillation,
- 12 the chance of survival decreases by approximately 10%; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Lifesaving treatments for sudden cardiac arrest are
- 14 effective if administered in time; and
- 15 WHEREAS, According to the American Heart Association,
- 16 cardiopulmonary resuscitation and early defibrillation with an
- 17 AED more than double the chances that a victim will survive; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Sudden cardiac arrest is frequently the outcome of
- 19 an underlying heart condition and is often secondary to other
- 20 conditions such as impact to the chest, heat stroke, asthma,
- 21 drowning, electrocution and allergic reaction or adverse
- 22 reaction to medication; and
- 23 WHEREAS, There is a need for comprehensive educational
- 24 efforts designed to increase awareness of sudden cardiac arrest
- 25 among medical professionals and the greater public in order to
- 26 promote early detection and proper treatment of this disease and
- 27 to improve quality of life; therefore be it
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 29 month of October 2017 as "Sudden Cardiac Arrest Awareness Month"
- 30 in Pennsylvania to increase awareness and prompt treatment of

1 sudden cardiac arrest.
