## A RESOLUTION

- Congratulating the Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance
  Agency's Board of Directors, work force and management during
- its 50th year of service to Pennsylvania students, families
- and taxpayers on behalf of the Commonwealth.
- 5 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency
- 6 was established by an act of the General Assembly on August 7,
- 7 1963; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania voters approved by referendum the Act
- 9 to amend the Constitution of Pennsylvania on November 5, 1963,
- 10 thereby providing for student grant and student lending to
- 11 Pennsylvania citizens pursuing a postsecondary education; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The agency was designated in 1964 by the United
- 13 States Department of Education as the Federal student loan
- 14 quarantor for Pennsylvania, and has since then quaranteed \$109

- 1 billion in student loans; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The agency was authorized by the General Assembly to
- 3 administer the State-funded Pennsylvania State Grant Program in
- 4 1965, and has since disbursed more than \$8.7 billion in State
- 5 grants to 2.2 million Pennsylvania students; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The General Assembly enacted legislation in 1972
- 7 that allowed for student loan servicing activity to help support
- 8 the agency's public service mission, thereby solidifying its
- 9 path toward self-sufficient operations, which has saved
- 10 taxpayers billions of dollars over the years; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The agency began operating nationally as American
- 12 Education Services, a Federal student loan guarantor and student
- 13 loan servicer to generate additional resources to support
- 14 Pennsylvania students and families pursuing a higher education;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, The agency was selected by the United States
- 17 Department of Education in 2009 to help service the nation's
- 18 growing portfolio of Federal direct student loans, prompting the
- 19 creation of the agency's FedLoan Servicing operation, which
- 20 currently services \$144 billion in loans for nearly 6.2 million
- 21 students; and
- 22 WHEREAS, The agency has created thousands of jobs for
- 23 generations of Pennsylvania citizens, and currently operates
- 24 facilities in Allegheny, Dauphin, Cumberland, Centre and
- 25 Delaware counties, which are staffed by more than 2,924
- 26 hardworking people who are committed to the support of the
- 27 agency's public service mission; and
- 28 WHEREAS, The agency, through the dedication of its employees
- 29 and the quidance of its bipartisan Board of Directors, has
- 30 contributed well over \$1 billion in direct public service

- 1 support for Pennsylvania students and families; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The agency provides an additional \$90 million in the
- 3 current fiscal year to supplement the State Grant Program, the
- 4 Pennsylvania Targeted Industry Program and a new Distance
- 5 Education Pilot Program, providing for more meaningful grant
- 6 awards to more Pennsylvania students with financial need; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The agency celebrates its 50th year of service to
- 8 the Commonwealth as a premier student aid resource, program
- 9 administrator, solutions innovator, job creator and public
- 10 servant; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives extend its
- 12 congratulations and sincere appreciation to the Pennsylvania
- 13 Higher Education Assistance Agency's Board of Directors, work
- 14 force and management during its 50th year of service to
- 15 Pennsylvania students, families and taxpayers on behalf of the
- 16 Commonwealth.
