## A RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Designating the week of November 12 through 18, 2017, as "Diabetes and Cardiovascular Disease Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
4	WHEREAS, Approximately 1.4 million Pennsylvanians have
5	diabetes, a chronic condition that occurs when the body does not
6	properly produce or use the hormone insulin that regulates blood
7	sugar; and
8	WHEREAS, An additional 3.5 million Pennsylvanians have
9	prediabetes, which is an elevated blood sugar level not yet high
10	enough to be diagnosed as diabetes; and
11	WHEREAS, Type 2 diabetes is the most common type of diabetes,
12	representing an estimated 90% to 95% of all diagnosed adult
13	diabetes cases in the United States; and
14	WHEREAS, Individuals with type 2 diabetes have a two to four

times greater risk of developing cardiovascular disease; and 1 2 WHEREAS, Cardiovascular disease, the term used to define 3 problems with the heart and blood vessels, including heart attacks, heart failure and strokes, is the leading cause of 4 death associated with diabetes due to complications associated 5 with diabetes, including high blood sugar, high blood pressure 6 7 and obesity; and

8 WHEREAS, Cardiovascular disease accounts for 68% of deaths in individuals with type 2 diabetes in the United States; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Diabetes treatment costs an estimated \$13.4 billion in Pennsylvania each year, and cardiovascular disease accounts 11 for an estimated 28% of costs for treating diabetes patients; 12 13 and

14 WHEREAS, Findings from a recent study revealed that 52% of 15 adults living with type 2 diabetes are unaware that they are at an increased risk of cardiovascular disease; and 16

17 WHEREAS, Appropriate awareness and education about the 18 cardiovascular risks associated with diabetes can effectively 19 improve outcomes and reduce the overall financial burden of the 20 illness; and

21 WHEREAS, The Department of Health and other relevant partners seek to promote awareness, education and action related to 22 23 diabetes and the link to cardiovascular disease; and 24 WHEREAS, The month of November is "American Diabetes Month"; 25 therefore be it

26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the week of November 12 through 18, 2017, as "Diabetes and 27 28 Cardiovascular Disease Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania; and be 29 it further
