A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing September 11, 2015, as "Keystone Wounded Warrior Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, According to a February 2013 Congressional Research
- 4 Service report entitled "U.S. Military Casualty Statistics:
- 5 Operation New Dawn, Operation Iraqi Freedom, and Operation
- 6 Enduring Freedom," 50,450 United States service members have
- 7 been wounded since Operation Iraqi Freedom first began; and
- 8 WHEREAS, From 2002 to December 2012, 103,792 service members
- 9 who were deployed in these conflicts were diagnosed with post-
- 10 traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and 253,330 service members
- 11 were diagnosed with a traumatic brain injury of some kind; and
- 12 WHEREAS, As a result of battle injuries, 1,715 service
- 13 members received wounds that required amputations and 1,493 have

- 1 lost major limbs; and
- 2 WHEREAS, According to the Department of Defense, as of
- 3 January 9, 2013, 235 service members have died of self-inflicted
- 4 wounds while serving in Operation Iraqi Freedom or Operation New
- 5 Dawn and 97 have died of self-inflicted wounds while serving in
- 6 Operation Enduring Freedom; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Founded in 2009, Keystone Wounded Warriors is an
- 8 eastern Pennsylvania-based nonprofit corporation that seeks to
- 9 honor the daily sacrifices made by the brave men and women in
- 10 all branches of the United States Armed Forces and specifically
- 11 focuses on those wounded on or after September 11, 2001; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Keystone Wounded Warriors aids Pennsylvania Wounded
- 13 Warriors by raising public awareness and seeking public support
- 14 of programs and services that assist our wounded warriors as
- 15 they transition back to civilian life; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Keystone Wounded Warriors provide direct resources
- 17 for daily needs such as groceries and personal items for wounded
- 18 warriors and their families, help to provide specialized
- 19 physical training and goal setting to ensure our wounded
- 20 warriors have the opportunity to stay active and provide
- 21 counseling and mentorship by working with local veterans'
- 22 counseling centers; therefore be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize
- 24 September 11, 2015, as "Keystone Wounded Warrior Day" in
- 25 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage the
- 27 residents of this great Commonwealth to support groups such as
- 28 Keystone Wounded Warriors to ensure that the many sacrifices of
- 29 our brave servicemen and servicewomen are not forgotten.
