A RESOLUTION

- 1 Honoring the continuing work of the Veterans Courts in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, With more than 1 million veterans in Pennsylvania,
- 4 the Supreme Court recognized a need for a problem solving court
- 5 to address the unique issues involving Pennsylvania's veterans;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, Veterans Courts are designed to assist veterans
- 8 charged with crimes who are struggling with addiction, mental
- 9 illness or co-occurring disorders and come in contact with the
- 10 criminal justice system; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Veterans Courts connect veterans with services,
- 12 benefits and program providers to ultimately reduce recidivism
- 13 among military veterans; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Veterans involved in Veterans Courts receive support
- 15 and guidance from veteran mentors, are supervised by specialized
- 16 probation officers and receive treatment and support from the

- 1 Veterans Administration to address underlying problems often
- 2 caused by posttraumatic stress disorder; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The first Veterans Court in Pennsylvania opened in
- 4 Lackawanna County in 2009; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Veterans Courts are now located in 20 counties
- 6 within Pennsylvania; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Working with the Administrative Office of
- 8 Pennsylvania Courts, the Veterans Administration and the
- 9 Statewide Veterans Justice Partnership Task Force, the Supreme
- 10 Court has advanced the concept and implementation of the
- 11 Veterans Judicial Courts; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania continues to innovate and implement the
- 13 Veterans Court system by working with the National Center for
- 14 State Courts to develop performance measures for Commonwealth
- 15 Veterans Treatment Courts that may also be used as a nationwide
- 16 resource; therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the
- 18 continuing work of the Veterans Courts in Pennsylvania; and be
- 19 it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That, in honoring this work, we raise awareness of
- 21 the efforts of the Veterans Courts in Pennsylvania to provide
- 22 comprehensive treatment, resources and support with the goals of
- 23 encouraging rehabilitation and reducing recidivism among
- 24 Pennsylvania's large military veteran population.
