1 2	Designating the month of April 2023 as "Autism Acceptance Month" in Pennsylvania.	
3	WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorder is a complex disability	<
4	requiring greater recognition, understanding and acceptance to	
5	ensure that all individuals living with autism spectrum disorder	-<
6	ON THE SPECTRUM are accurately diagnosed and appropriately	<
7	supported throughout their lives; and	
8	WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorder is a lifelong neurological	<
9	and developmental disability resulting in impairment of	<
10	DIFFERENCES IN an individual's ability to learn and develop	<
11	healthy interactive behaviors and understand verbal, nonverbal	<
12	and reciprocal DIFFERENCES IN VERBAL AND NONVERBAL	<
13	communication; and	
14	WHEREAS, Autism is defined by a certain set of behaviors and	<
15	is a "spectrum disorder" that affects individuals differently	
16	and to varying degrees; and

- 2 growing developmental disorders DISABILITIES in the United <--

- 4 WHEREAS, There is no known single cause of autism, but
- 5 increased awareness, funding and acceptance can help PEOPLE AND <--
- 6 THEIR families today; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Although a cure for autism spectrum disorder has not <--
- 8 been found, individuals living with autism spectrum disorder
- 9 INDIVIDUALS LIVING ON THE SPECTRUM can be assisted in reaching <--
- 10 their greatest potential through accurate early diagnosis,
- 11 appropriate education and intervention; and
- 12 WHEREAS, According to the Centers for Disease Control and
- 13 Prevention, 1 in 54 individuals under 21 years of age are
- 14 affected by autism spectrum disorder HAVE AUTISM; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The number of adults living with autism spectrum <--
- 16 disorder ON THE SPECTRUM is expected to increase dramatically <--
- 17 over the next few years as adolescents age into adulthood; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Individuals of all genders, races, ethnicities and
- 19 economic backgrounds can be diagnosed with autism spectrum
- 20 disorder; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorder is four times more likely
- 22 to affect boys than girls; and HAVE AUTISM; AND
- 23 WHEREAS, One in 27 boys and 1 in 116 girls are diagnosed with
- 24 autism spectrum disorder; and
- 25 WHEREAS, A GROWING BODY OF RESEARCH SUGGESTS THAT DIAGNOSTIC <
- 26 BIAS MAY CONTRIBUTE TO THE GREATER LIKELIHOOD THAT WOMEN AND
- 27 GIRLS ARE MISDIAGNOSED, UNDERDIAGNOSED OR DIAGNOSED LATER IN
- 28 LIFE; AND
- 29 WHEREAS, STUDIES HAVE SHOWN DIFFERENCES IN AUTISM SYMPTOMS BY
- 30 GENDER, WHICH ARE NOT ALWAYS REFLECTED IN THE DIAGNOSTIC

- WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorder can OFTEN be reliably

- 4 WHEREAS, Autism spectrum disorder is more difficult to <--
- 5 diagnose in adults than children AND HIGHLIGHTS THE IMPORTANCE <--
- 6 OF PROVIDER COMPETENCE IN THE EVALUATION AND DIAGNOSIS OF
- 7 AUTISM; and
- 8 WHEREAS, There may be more than 185,000 individuals on the
- 9 autism spectrum in Pennsylvania; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The Department of Human Services created the Office
- 11 of Developmental Programs, which includes the Bureau of Supports
- 12 for Autism and Special Populations, to provide expertise and
- 13 support for all agencies serving Pennsylvanians living with <--
- 14 autism spectrum disorder ON THE SPECTRUM; therefore be it
- 15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 16 month of April 2023 as "Autism Acceptance Month" in
- 17 Pennsylvania.
