A RESOLUTION

- Designating the week of September 24 through 30, 2017, as
 "Juvenile Detention Centers and Alternative Programs Week" in
 Pennsylvania.

 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's array of public and private service
 providers have continued to evolve in response to juvenile
- 6 justice system reform efforts by improving the quality of
- 7 service delivery and simultaneously striving to ensure the
- 8 protection of our communities; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania service providers have adapted to
- 10 serving low-risk to moderate-risk youths within the community
- 11 and moderate-risk to high-risk youths in residential programs;
- 12 and
- WHEREAS, Pennsylvania service providers offer uniquely
- 14 designed programs to all 67 counties of this Commonwealth to
- 15 address the individualized needs of specific populations; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania service providers offer an array of
- 17 services, including secure detention, secure treatment,

- 1 institutional facilities, group homes, foster homes and
- 2 community-based and in-home programming; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's juvenile detention centers and
- 4 alternative programs, adhering to the Balanced and Restorative
- 5 Justice Model, contribute to public safety by providing a stable
- 6 environment for at-risk youths, providing education and
- 7 programming and ensuring sufficient opportunities for growth and
- 8 development of Pennsylvania's youths; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Juvenile detention centers and alternative programs
- 10 ensure every child's health and well-being by providing
- 11 competency development, self-discipline and stabilization
- 12 through comprehensive physical and behavioral health evaluations
- 13 as well as community involvement; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Thousands of men and women are dedicated to ensuring
- 15 the proper care and supervision of youths and are committed to
- 16 the protection of Pennsylvania's communities; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Youth care workers in Pennsylvania detention centers
- 18 and alternative programs stand ready on a daily basis to respond
- 19 to youths who display an array of unresolved mental health,
- 20 behavioral, educational and emotional issues; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The Juvenile Detention Centers and Alternative
- 22 Programs, an affiliate of the County Commissioners Association
- 23 of Pennsylvania, is an association of Pennsylvania service
- 24 providers that acts as a key resource for these service
- 25 providers offering education, representation and support for the
- 26 important services they provide; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's juvenile justice service providers in
- 28 coordination with the Juvenile Detention Centers and Alternative
- 29 Programs merit one week of recognition for their unending
- 30 services aimed at protecting our communities and assisting

- 1 Pennsylvania's youths; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 3 week of September 24 through 30, 2017 as "Juvenile Detention
- 4 Centers and Alternative Programs Week" in Pennsylvania.
