A RESOLUTION

1 Designating Wednesday, October 14, 2015, as "Pennsylvania Job
2 Corps Day" in Pennsylvania.

3 WHEREAS, The United States Department of Labor established
4 Job Corps in 1964 to achieve the goal of providing hands-on
5 training to low-income students in America's fastest growing
6 careers; and

7 WHEREAS, Job Corps is the nation's largest technical training
8 and education program for low-income students between 16 and 24
9 years of age; and

10 WHEREAS, An estimated 60,000 students per year benefit from
11 the Job Corps program; and

12 WHEREAS, There are more than 100 industries and career paths
13 that students may pursue, including: automotive and machine
14 repair, construction, finance and business services, health
15 care, hospitality, information technology, manufacturing and

1 renewable resources; and

2 WHEREAS, Job Corps offers students the opportunity to earn a
3 high school diploma or a GED for those youth who have neither;
4 and

5 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has four Job Corps Centers at the
6 following locations:

8 (2) Philadelphia, 2810 South 20th Street, Building 12,
9 Philadelphia, PA 19145.

10 (3) Pittsburgh, 7175 Highland Drive, Pittsburgh, PA

15 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate
16 Wednesday, October 14, 2015, as "Pennsylvania Job Corps Day" in
17 Pennsylvania in order to honor the important work and resources
18 that Pennsylvania's four Job Corps Centers provide for low-
19 income youth in this Commonwealth.
