A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Establishing a special bipartisan, bicameral legislative 1 commission to study challenges in the Pennsylvania 2 unemployment compensation system and issue a report with its 3 findings and recommendations. 4 5 WHEREAS, Swift delivery of unemployment compensation benefits 6 is essential in providing a financial lifeline to Pennsylvanians who have lost jobs during the COVID-19 disaster emergency; and 8 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's unemployment rate currently exceeds 9 8% during the COVID-19 pandemic, and unemployment compensation 10 benefits have been a vital financial resource for hundreds of thousands of Pennsylvanians who are out of work through no fault 11 12 of their own; and 13 WHEREAS, More than 2.5 million Pennsylvanians have applied 14 for unemployment compensation benefits since the beginning of 15 this pandemic, and as of December 5, 2020, the average number of 16 new weekly claims exceeds 40,000; and WHEREAS, As of October 2020, nearly 70,000 unemployment 17

compensation claims remain pending in the unemployment

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- 1 compensation system, and thousands of claimants have waited
- 2 weeks or months as the Department of Labor and Industry attempts
- 3 to examine and process an unprecedented number of claims while
- 4 investigating attempts at fraud; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania's unemployment compensation system has
- 6 demonstrated an inability to handle the sudden substantial
- 7 influx in claims, with many claims remaining unresolved; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Identifying and ameliorating stumbling blocks
- 9 causing delays within the unemployment compensation system
- 10 serves both claimants and unemployment compensation examiners in
- 11 accelerating the processing of claims, increasing the efficiency
- 12 of the unemployment compensation system and releasing department
- 13 resources to combat fraud; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth's efforts to promptly deliver
- 15 benefits to qualified claimants has been hindered by outdated
- 16 systems, an insufficient number of staff and a high volume of
- 17 claims; therefore be it
- 18 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 19 establish a special bipartisan, bicameral legislative commission
- 20 to study the delivery of unemployment compensation benefits to
- 21 claimants in this Commonwealth; and be it further
- 22 RESOLVED, That the commission develop reports to include
- 23 background information into matters relevant to this resolution,
- 24 make recommendations for the improvement of the unemployment
- 25 compensation system and propose legislation in furtherance of
- 26 its recommendations; and be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the commission shall consist of the following
- 28 members:
- 29 (1) The Attorney General or a designee;
- 30 (2) The Auditor General or a designee;

- 1 (3) The State Treasurer or a designee;
- 2 (4) The Secretary of Labor and Industry or a designee;
- 3 (5) The Executive Deputy Secretary of Labor and Industry
- 4 or a designee;
- 5 (6) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the 6 Labor and Industry Committee of the Senate or designees;
- 7 (7) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the 8 Labor and Industry Committee of the House of Representatives 9 or designees;
- 10 (8) The Deputy Secretary for Unemployment Compensation 11 Programs or a designee;
- 12 (9) The Deputy Chief Counsel of the Unemployment
 13 Compensation Division or a designee;
- 14 (10) The chairperson of the Unemployment Compensation 15 Appeals Board of Review or a designee;
- 16 (11) The director of the Office of Unemployment
 17 Compensation Service Centers or a designee;
- 18 (12) The director of the Office of Unemployment 19 Compensation Benefits Policy or a designee;
- 20 (13) Six administrators of regional unemployment 21 compensation service centers;
- 22 (14) The Deputy Treasurer for Fiscal Operations or a 23 designee;
- 24 (15) The executive director of the Pennsylvania Budget 25 and Policy Center or a designee;
- 26 (16) The chairperson of Philadelphia Legal Assistance or a designee;
- 28 (17) The executive director of Community Legal Services 29 or a designee; and
- 30 (18) The executive director of the National Employment

- 1 Law Project or a designee;
- 2 and be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That the commission may hold informational meetings
- 4 to hear testimony from experts and others with knowledge of this
- 5 subject; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee
- 7 provide staff support to the commission and assist with the
- 8 final report; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the commission issue an initial report of its
- 10 findings and recommendations to the General Assembly no later
- 11 than six months after the adoption of this resolution, with the
- 12 issuance of a final report no later than one year after the
- 13 issuance of the initial report; and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the members of the commission shall serve
- 15 without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for all necessary
- 16 and reasonable expenses incurred in the performance of their
- 17 duties; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That reasonable expenses incurred by the commission
- 19 be equally divided between the Senate and the House of
- 20 Representatives; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That the approval of the chairperson and minority
- 22 chairperson of the Labor and Industry Committee of the Senate
- 23 and the chairperson and minority chairperson of the Labor and
- 24 Industry Committee of the House of Representatives, by action of
- 25 a majority of members of the committees, shall be required to
- 26 preauthorize all proposed actions of the commission which will
- 27 entail the expenditure of State funds and shall also be required
- 28 to approve all expenditures, including expense reimbursement
- 29 requests of commission members, prior to payment.
