## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the President and the Congress of the United States to 2 make emergency financial resources available to assist Puerto
- Rico and its residents in recovering from Hurricane Maria.
- 4 WHEREAS, Nearly two weeks after Puerto Rico sustained damage
- 5 caused by Hurricane Irma, Hurricane Maria made landfall in
- 6 Puerto Rico during the early hours of the morning of September
- 7 20, 2017; and
- 8 WHEREAS, According to a statement issued by the island's
- 9 emergency management officials, Puerto Rico has been destroyed
- 10 due to damaging rain and winds in excess of 155 mph; and
- 11 WHEREAS, In recent years Puerto Rico has been burdened by a
- 12 debt crisis exceeding \$9 billion, which resulted in the
- 13 bankruptcy of the island's utility service in July; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Unfortunately, necessary upgrades and improvements
- 15 to utility services have not been completed in recent years,
- 16 further jeopardizing the island's electrical grid and

- 1 infrastructure; and
- 2 WHEREAS, With an inadequate infrastructure already in place,
- 3 the result of damage sustained from Hurricane Maria has left the
- 4 residents of Puerto Rico without electricity and with extremely
- 5 limited cell phone service, emergency and medical services and
- 6 access to clean water and food supplies; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In some cases, the loss of communications has made
- 8 it virtually impossible for injured residents to call for or
- 9 receive lifesaving services; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Limited communications have also impacted much of
- 11 this Commonwealth's Puerto Rican population, who are unable to
- 12 reach family members located on the island; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania ranks fourth nationwide in the number
- 14 of Puerto Ricans living in the United States, with this
- 15 Commonwealth's Puerto Rican population totaling nearly 366,000;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, One-third of this Commonwealth's total Puerto Rican
- 18 population resides in Philadelphia; and
- 19 WHEREAS, Sadly, residents of Puerto Rico face numerous
- 20 obstacles in their attempt to return to their normal, everyday
- 21 lives and have little hope of receiving emergency services in
- 22 the near future without the aid from the United States;
- 23 therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge the
- 25 President and the Congress of the United States to swiftly make
- 26 emergency financial resources available to assist Puerto Rico
- 27 and its residents in recovering from Hurricane Maria; and be it
- 28 further
- 29 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 30 the President of the United States, the presiding officers of

- 2 Pennsylvania.
