A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the week of October 21 through 27, 2019, as "Environmental Justice Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, The first National People of Color Environmental
4	Leadership Summit was held October 24 through 27, 1991, in
5	Washington, DC; and
6	WHEREAS, Seventeen principles of environmental justice were
7	adopted at the summit; and
8	WHEREAS, The principles have served as the defining document
9	and basis for the grassroots movement for environmental justice;
10	and
11	WHEREAS, Gathered together at the summit, delegates
12	established a national and international movement on behalf of
13	all people of color to fight the destruction of lands and
14	communities and to reestablish their spiritual interdependence
15	to the sacredness of Mother Earth; and
16	WHEREAS. The delegates strove to create a level of respect

1 for differing cultures, languages and beliefs about the natural 2 world and individuals' roles in healing themselves and ensure 3 environmental justice and promote economic alternatives that 4 would contribute to the development of environmentally safe 5 livelihoods; and

6 WHEREAS, The adoption of the principles was also a step 7 toward securing the political, economic and cultural liberation 8 for all people of color who had been denied basic rights through 9 colonization and oppression for more than 500 years; and 10 WHEREAS, Specifically, the principles of environmental 11 justice:

(1) affirm the sacredness of Mother Earth, ecological
unity and the interdependence of all species and the right to
be free from ecological destruction;

15 (2) demand that public policy be based on mutual respect 16 and justice for all people, free from any form of 17 discrimination or bias;

18 (3) mandate the right to ethical, balanced and 19 responsible uses of land and renewable resources in the 20 interest of a sustainable planet for humans and other living 21 things;

(4) call for universal protection from nuclear testing,
extraction, production and disposal of toxic or hazardous
wastes and poisons and nuclear testing that threatens the
fundamental right to clean air, land, water and food;

(5) affirm the fundamental right to political, economic,
 cultural and environmental self-determination of all people;

(6) demand the cessation of the production of all
toxins, hazardous wastes and radioactive materials, and that
all past and current producers be held strictly accountable

1 to the people for detoxification and the containment at the 2 point of production;

3 (7) demand the right to participate as equal partners at
4 every level of decisionmaking, including needs assessment,
5 planning, implementation, enforcement and evaluation;

6 (8) affirm the right of all workers to a safe and
7 healthy work environment without being forced to choose
8 between unsafe working conditions and unemployment and the
9 right of those who work at home to be free from environmental
10 hazards;

(9) protect the right of victims of environmental injustice to receive full compensation and reparations for damages as well as quality health care;

14 (10) consider governmental acts of environmental 15 injustice a violation of international law, the Universal 16 Declaration of Human Rights and the United Nations Convention 17 on Genocide;

18 (11) recognize a special legal relationship of Native
19 Americans to the United States Government through treaties,
20 agreements, compacts and covenants affirming sovereignty and
21 self-determination;

(12) affirm the need for urban and rural ecological policies to clean up and rebuild our cities and rural areas in balance with nature, honoring the cultural integrity of all our communities and providing fair access for all people to the full range of resources;

(13) call for the strict enforcement of principles of informed consent and a halt to the testing of experimental reproductive and medical procedures and vaccinations on people of color;

(14) oppose the destructive operations of multinational
 corporations;

3 (15) oppose military occupation, repression and
4 exploitation of lands, people, cultures and other life forms;

5 (16) call for the education of present and future 6 generations, which emphasizes social and environmental 7 issues, based on our experience and an appreciation of our 8 diverse cultural perspectives; and

9 (17) require that individuals make personal choices to 10 consume as little of Mother Earth's resources and produce as 11 little waste as possible and make the conscious decision to 12 challenge and reprioritize their lifestyles to ensure the 13 health of the natural world for present and future 14 generations;

15 therefore be it

16 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the 17 week of October 21 through 27, 2019, as "Environmental Justice 18 Week" in Pennsylvania.
