A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the month of January 2016 as "Big Brothers Big Sisters Month and National Mentoring Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Big Brothers Big Sisters is a nonprofit organization
- 4 which establishes mentoring relationships to bring caring adults
- 5 into the lives of underserved and vulnerable children and
- 6 youths; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Children and youths who live in an area with a high
- 8 poverty rate or high incidence of juvenile arrests, come from a
- 9 single-parent household, are impacted by homelessness or
- 10 familial incarceration or attend a struggling school are often
- 11 at risk for academic or social failure; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Experienced persons serving as advisors, motivators
- 13 and friends can diminish risk factors, support positive outcomes

- 1 and make a lasting impact on the lives of younger persons; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Working through a network of donors, partners,
- 3 family members, volunteers and advocates, Big Brothers Big
- 4 Sisters supports and enriches the life of each participant while
- 5 promoting and reinforcing positive activities, behaviors and
- 6 attitudes in our communities; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Children and youths who participate in Big Brothers
- 8 Big Sisters perform better in school and develop better
- 9 relationships with their families and peers; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Children and youths facing adverse or challenging
- 11 circumstances particularly benefit from strong, enduring,
- 12 professionally supported one-on-one mentoring relationships; and
- 13 WHEREAS, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Southeastern
- 14 Pennsylvania makes meaningful, monitored matches between adult
- 15 volunteers (Bigs) and young people (Littles) throughout Chester,
- 16 Delaware, Montgomery and Philadelphia Counties; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Southeastern
- 18 Pennsylvania, partnering with parents or guardians and community
- 19 volunteers, makes and supports nearly 3,000 mentoring matches
- 20 each year; and
- 21 WHEREAS, An estimated 120,000 underserved children in
- 22 southeastern Pennsylvania remain at risk for social or academic
- 23 failure; and
- 24 WHEREAS, Under the leadership of Chief Executive Officer
- 25 Marcus Allen, Big Brothers Big Sisters of Southeastern
- 26 Pennsylvania is committed to providing academic, employment,
- 27 housing and family support services as needed to address the
- 28 personal challenges and higher aspirations of children and
- 29 youths throughout the region; therefore be it
