A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the week of January 29 through February 2, 2018, as 2 "Tax Identity Theft Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Tax-related identity theft was the most common form
- 4 of identity theft reported to the Federal Trade Commission in
- 5 2014; and
- 6 WHEREAS, According to the Internal Revenue Service, more than
- 7 300,000 American taxpayers had their tax return details stolen
- 8 as a result of the 2015 security breach; and
- 9 WHEREAS, According to the Internal Revenue Service,
- 10 approximately \$5.8 billion in fraudulent tax refunds were paid
- 11 in 2013 related to identity theft; and
- 12 WHEREAS, According to the Federal Trade Commission, tax
- 13 refund fraud is the largest and fastest growing identity theft
- 14 category; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Approximately 5,000 victims have paid more than
- 16 \$28.5 million to scammers who pose as IRS agents according to

- 1 the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration; therefore
- 2 be it
- 3 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 4 week of January 29 through February 2, 2018, as "Tax Identity
- 5 Theft Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
