A RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Directing the Joint State Government Commission to study the effectiveness of the Department of Education's Office for Dispute Resolution.
4	WHEREAS, A free and appropriate education is available to all
5	children with disabilities in this Commonwealth; and
6	WHEREAS, The Commonwealth maintains procedures in accordance
7	with Federal law to ensure that children with disabilities and
8	their parents are guaranteed procedural safeguards with respect
9	to the provision of a free and appropriate education; and
10	WHEREAS, The Department of Education established the Office
11	for Dispute Resolution to provide due process for students with
12	disabilities and their parents who believe their school district
13	is not providing the student with a free and appropriate
14	education; and
15	WHEREAS, Parents who believe that their child is not
16	receiving a free and appropriate education and who are unable to
17	agree to a resolution with the school district may request a due
18	process hearing through the Office for Dispute Resolution; and

WHEREAS, At the due process hearing, a neutral hearing
 officer will hear testimony and examine evidence from both the
 parents and the school district; and

4 WHEREAS, At the conclusion of the due process hearing, the 5 hearing officer will issue a written decision, which is a 6 legally enforceable document setting forth the legal obligations 7 of all parties; and

8 WHEREAS, If the parents or school district disagree with the 9 decision of the hearing officer, the decision may be appealed in 10 either Federal or State court; therefore be it

11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint 12 State Government Commission to study the effectiveness of the 13 Department of Education's Office for Dispute Resolution; and be 14 it further

15 RESOLVED, That the study include all of the following:

16 (1) The number of hearing officer decisions that were17 appealed to either a Federal or State court.

18 (2) The final verdict of any hearing officer decision19 appealed to a Federal or State court.

20 (3) The process by which other states provide due
21 process for students with disabilities as required by the
22 Federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act.

(4) The litigation costs to school districts, including
attorney fees and compensatory education, of all due process
hearings.

(5) The litigation costs to school districts, including
attorney fees and compensatory education, of all hearing
officer decisions appealed to either a Federal or State
court;
