- 5 WHEREAS, Zeta Phi Beta was originally founded in 1920 by five
- 6 conscientious collegiate women on the campus of Howard
- 7 University in Washington, DC; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Zeta Phi Beta has continued its steady climb into
- 9 the national spotlight with programs designed to demonstrate
- 10 concern for the human condition both nationally and
- 11 internationally; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., and Zeta Phi Beta
- 13 Sorority, Inc., are the only National Pan-Hellenic Council
- 14 organizations that can claim an authentic brother-sister
- 15 association through a constitutional bond; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Zeta Phi Beta boasts numerous collegiate and alumnae
- 17 chapters within this Commonwealth, as well as more than 125,000
- 18 members in 800 chapters located around the world; and

- 2 to work closely together as they attempt to materialize what
- 3 their founders envisioned through a deep and abiding dedication
- 4 to enhancing and promoting systematic fellowship, African-
- 5 American self-determination, justice, equal rights and service

- 9 programs, including, among other programs, the Elder Care
