- 7 WHEREAS, The STEM Education Coalition has made it their
- 8 mission to inform Federal and State policymakers on the
- 9 importance of the role that STEM education plays in the
- 10 innovative competitiveness and future economy of the United
- 11 States; and
- 12 WHEREAS, STEM subjects encompass the foundational skills
- 13 necessary for securing well-paying jobs in today's fastest
- 14 growing science and technological industries, and it is the goal

- 1 of the coalition to foster and support students and educators
- 2 committed to this area of study; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The coalition works to inspire students, especially
- 4 those of disadvantaged groups, women and veterans, urging a
- 5 broad platform of students to obtain the knowledge and
- 6 professional skills necessary to obtain STEM-based careers; and
