INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35, MARCH 13, 2018

A RESOLUTION

Urging the United States Secretary of Health and Human Services 2 to select the former Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base Willow Grove and the former Naval Air Warfare Center 3 Warminster and Horsham, Warrington and Warminster Townships for an exposure assessment and study on human health implications of perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances 6 7 contamination. 8 WHEREAS, The United States military used foam containing perfluorooctane sulfonate (PFOS) and perfluorooctanoic acid 10 (PFOA), unregulated contaminants, in firefighting training at 11 two former bases, Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base Willow 12 Grove in Horsham Township, Montgomery County, and Naval Air 13 Warfare Center Warminster in Warminster Township, Bucks County, 14 Pennsylvania; and 15 WHEREAS, The former Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base 16 Willow Grove is the location of Horsham Air Guard Station, an 17 active base of the Pennsylvania Air National Guard; and 18 WHEREAS, The chemicals have appeared in elevated levels in

public and private water wells; and

- 1 WHEREAS, PFOS and PFOA are "extremely persistent in the
- 2 environment and resistant to typical environmental degradation
- 3 processes," according to the Environmental Protection Agency
- 4 (EPA), which has also stated: "The toxicity, mobility and
- 5 bioaccumulation potential of PFOS and PFOA pose potential
- 6 adverse effects for the environment and human health"; and
- 7 WHEREAS, A growing body of science has established
- 8 associations between PFOS and PFOA and a range of health
- 9 effects, including a variety of cancers; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The chemicals were first discovered in local public
- 11 water supplies near the former military bases by an EPA testing
- 12 program, resulting in several public water wells being taken
- 13 offline; and
- 14 WHEREAS, On May 19, 2016, the EPA issued an update to its
- 15 health advisory for PFOS and PFOA that significantly reduces the
- 16 amount considered safe in drinking water: in the worst possible
- 17 case, water containing the chemicals at an amount previously
- 18 deemed safe would now be more than eight times over the
- 19 recommended limits; and
- 20 WHEREAS, The new recommended levels have resulted in
- 21 officials from the Horsham Water and Sewer Authority, Warminster
- 22 Municipal Authority and Warrington Township Water and Sewer
- 23 Department shutting down contaminated public drinking water
- 24 wells, including 16 municipal wells in Horsham, Warrington and
- 25 Warminster Townships and nearly 150 private wells; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Section 316 of the National Defense Authorization
- 27 Act for Fiscal Year 2018 (Public Law 115-91, 131 Stat. 1283
- 28 requires the United States Secretary of Health and Human
- 29 Services to conduct an exposure assessment of at least eight
- 30 current or former domestic military installations known to have

- 1 perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFASs)
- 2 contamination, which includes PFOS and PFOA, in addition to
- 3 commencing a study on the human health implications of PFASs
- 4 contamination in sources of water and relevant exposure
- 5 pathways; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 7 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the United States Secretary of
- 8 Health and Human Services to select these two installations and
- 9 Horsham, Warrington and Warminster Townships for the exposure
- 10 assessment and the study on human health implications; and be it
- 11 further
- 12 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 13 the President of the United States, to the presiding officers of
- 14 each house of Congress, to each member of Congress from
- 15 Pennsylvania, to the United States Secretary of Health and Human
- 16 Services and to the United States Secretary of Defense.
