A RESOLUTION

- Designating January 26, 2020, as "Kawasaki Disease Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Kawasaki disease, also known as Kawasaki syndrome,
- 4 is a serious illness characterized by inflammation of blood
- 5 vessels throughout the body that primarily affects young
- 6 children and infants; and
- 7 WHEREAS, On January 26, 1961, Dr. Tomisaku Kawasaki, a
- 8 Japanese pediatrician, discovered a pattern of symptoms that
- 9 would later be named Kawasaki disease; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Symptoms of Kawasaki disease include a fever lasting
- 11 at least five days, red bloodshot eyes, rash, inflammation of
- 12 the mouth, lips and throat and swollen hands, feet and lymph
- 13 nodes; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The first cases of Kawasaki disease reported outside
- 15 of Japan were in Hawaii in 1976; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Although Kawasaki disease is more prevalent among
- 17 children of Asian and Pacific Island descent, this illness

- 1 affects all racial and ethnic groups; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Kawasaki disease is more prevalent in male children
- 3 than female children; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Approximately 75% of Kawasaki disease patients are
- 5 under five years of age and the majority of cases are diagnosed
- 6 in winter and early spring; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention
- 8 estimates 3,277 children under the age of five were hospitalized
- 9 with Kawasaki disease in 2000, and that number increased to
- 10 4,040 in 2009; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Without the standard treatment of intravenous
- 12 immunoglobulin and aspirin, approximately 25% of children who
- 13 suffer from Kawasaki disease develop heart disease involving the
- 14 coronary arteries; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Kawasaki disease is the number one cause of acquired
- 16 heart disease in children in the United States; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Timely diagnosis and treatment is highly effective
- 18 in preventing coronary complications from Kawasaki disease; and
- 19 WHEREAS, The precise cause of Kawasaki disease is unknown,
- 20 and there is no test to definitively diagnose cases; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Lack of awareness among the public and health care
- 22 professionals may contribute to the underdiagnosis of Kawasaki
- 23 disease; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The growing prevalence of Kawasaki disease and the
- 25 risk of severe, life-threatening consequences expose the need
- 26 for further education for the general public, parents and health
- 27 care professionals; and
- WHEREAS, January 26, 2020, marks the 59th anniversary of the
- 29 discovery of Kawasaki disease; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate January

- 1 26, 2020, as "Kawasaki Disease Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania
- 2 and recognize the importance of awareness in diagnosing and
- 3 properly treating cases of Kawasaki disease.
