A RESOLUTION

1 Designating May 9, 2014, as "Pennsylvania Children's Mental
2 Health Awareness Day."

3 WHEREAS, Addressing the complex mental health needs of
4 children, youths and families today is fundamental to the future
5 of our Commonwealth; and

6 WHEREAS, Developing, implementing and maintaining access to a
7 comprehensive, coordinated system of mental health services for
8 children, youths and families Statewide is a critical
9 responsibility of State and county governments; and

10 WHEREAS, It is appropriate that we set aside one day each
11 year to direct our attention toward our children's mental health
12 and well-being and our system of related resources and services;
13 therefore be it

14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate May 9,

1 2014, as "Pennsylvania Children's Mental Health Awareness Day";
2 and be it further

3 RESOLVED, That all citizens, agencies and organizations
4 interested in meeting every child's mental health needs unite in
5 this observance and in addressing the fundamental necessity of a
6 comprehensive year-round mental health program for children,
