A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 2 3 4 5	Declaring that the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is committed to equal rights for individuals with cognitive disabilities to technology and information access and calling for implementation of these rights with deliberate speed.
6	WHEREAS, Nearly 30 million United States citizens have
7	cognitive disabilities, which include intellectual disability,
8	severe, persistent mental illness, pervasive developmental
9	disability, learning disability, brain injury, stroke and
10	neurodegenerative disorder, such as Alzheimer's or Parkinson's
11	disease; and
12	WHEREAS, The functional challenges that can accompany the
13	various types of cognitive disabilities include difficulties
14	with attentiveness, memory, comprehension, processing, problem-
15	solving, reading and language; and
16	WHEREAS, The disruptive convergence of computing and
17	communication technologies has substantially altered how people
18	acquire, utilize and disseminate knowledge and information; and
19	WHEREAS, Ninety-six percent of working Americans now use

1 information and communication technology, while the vast 2 majority of individuals with cognitive disabilities have limited 3 or no access to comprehensible information and usable 4 communication technologies; and

5 WHEREAS, Access to comprehensible information and usable 6 communication technologies is necessary for all individuals in 7 our society, particularly for individuals with cognitive 8 disabilities, to promote independence and self-determination and 9 to engage meaningfully in major aspects of life, such as 10 education, health promotion, employment, recreation and civic 11 participation; and

12 WHEREAS, To ensure individuals with cognitive disabilities 13 are entitled to inclusion and equal treatment in our democratic society, Federal laws, such as the Americans with Disabilities 14 15 Act of 1990 (ADA), the Individuals with Disabilities Education 16 Act (IDEA), the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act of 2000 (DD Act), sections 501, 504 and 508 of the 17 18 Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Twenty-First Century 19 Communications and Video Accessibility Act of 2010 (CVAA), as well as State and local laws, have been enacted and court 20 21 decisions have been made; and

22 WHEREAS, In order to enhance user independence, integration 23 and productivity, while reducing stigmas, individuals with 24 cognitive disabilities must have access to commercially 25 available devices and software that incorporate principles of 26 universal design, such as flexibility and ease of use for all; 27 and

28 WHEREAS, Technology and information access by individuals 29 with cognitive disabilities must be guided by standards and best 30 practices, such as personalization and compatibility across

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1 devices and platforms, and through the application of
2 innovations, including automated and predictive technologies;
3 and

WHEREAS, Security and privacy must be assured and managed to
protect the civil rights and personal dignity of individuals
with cognitive disabilities; and

7 WHEREAS, Enhanced public and private funding is urgently 8 needed to allow individuals with cognitive disabilities to utilize technology and access information as a natural 9 10 consequence of their rights to inclusion in our society; and 11 WHEREAS, Ensuring access to technology and information for 12 the approximately 30 million individuals with cognitive disabilities in the United States will create new markets and 13 14 employment opportunities, decrease dependency on public 15 services, reduce health care costs and improve the inclusion, 16 independence, productivity, self-determination and quality of 17 life of individuals with cognitive disabilities; therefore be it 18 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly 19 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania affirm our commitment to 20 equal rights for individuals with cognitive disabilities to 21 technology and information access and call for implementation of 22 these rights with deliberate speed; and be it further 23 RESOLVED, That certified copies of this resolution be 24 transmitted to the Governor, the presiding officers of each 25 house of Congress, each member of Congress from Pennsylvania and 26 the Chair of the Federal Communications Commission.

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
