## A RESOLUTION

Honoring the life of United States Capitol Police Officer Brian D. Sicknick.
wHEREAS, The people of the United States, the people of Pennsylvania and our institutions of democracy are safeguarded by peace officers who dedicate themselves to the security and safety of our nation and our State; and

WHEREAS, In this Commonwealth, the Bureau of Police and Safety, commonly known as the Pennsylvania Capitol Police, has maintained a safe and secure environment for employees and visitors in the Pennsylvania Capitol Complex since its establishment in 1895; and

WHEREAS, United States Capitol Police Officer Brian D. Sicknick was born in South River, New Jersey, and was a member of the New Jersey Air National Guard, where he served in Saudi Arabia and Kyrgyzstan; and

WHEREAS, Officer Sicknick joined the United States Capitol Police Department in 2008, where he continued to live up to the oath he swore in the military "to protect and defend the
Constitution of the United States"; and
WHEREAS, On January 7, 2021, Officer Sicknick died the day after an unlawful entry into the United States Capitol by a large number of individuals on January 6, 2021; and WHEREAS, The cause of Officer Sicknick's death is still under investigation and it is presumed to have occurred within the line of duty; and

WHEREAS, In recognition of his service to the nation, Officer Sicknick was given the rare distinction of lying in honor in the United States Capitol Rotunda, being only the fifth individual and third Capitol Police officer, to receive the designation; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor the life of United States Capitol Police Officer Brian D. Sicknick, who died on January 7, 2021.
