A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating the week of April 16 through 22, 2018, as "Clean
- Streams Week" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, There are more than 62,000 streams in this
- 4 Commonwealth covering nearly 83,000 miles that provide drinking
- 5 water, recreational opportunities, natural beauty and habitat
- 6 for Pennsylvania's wildlife; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth's Clean Streams Law was passed by
- 8 the General Assembly in 1937 to preserve and improve the purity
- 9 of the waters of this Commonwealth for the protection of public
- 10 health, animal and aquatic life, industrial consumption and
- 11 recreation; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Streams and rivers are an important source of
- 13 drinking water for Pennsylvania residents, making clean streams
- 14 vital to this Commonwealth's water security; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Fishing in Pennsylvania's streams is a popular

- 1 pastime and is part of an outdoor recreation industry that
- 2 contributed more than \$20 billion in consumer spending to this
- 3 Commonwealth's economy in 2016; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Trout populations serve as an indicator of a
- 5 stream's overall health; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission and Trout
- 7 Unlimited are currently working together to classify all of
- 8 Pennsylvania's streams based on trout habitat; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The flora and fauna found in streams are the
- 10 foundation of a healthy ecosystem; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Excessive agricultural runoff of nutrient-rich soil
- 12 into streams can damage ecosystems and create "dead zones" from
- 13 algae blooms; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Agricultural runoff is a major contributor to the
- 15 degradation of the Chesapeake Bay; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has already spent billions of dollars
- 17 on Chesapeake Bay cleanup and is obligated to spend billions
- 18 more; and
- 19 WHEREAS, According to the Department of Environmental
- 20 Protection, nearly 20,000 miles of Pennsylvania's waterways are
- 21 considered impaired, mostly from agricultural runoff and acid
- 22 mine drainage; and
- 23 WHEREAS, According to the United States Geological Survey,
- 24 more than 3,000 miles of streams in this Commonwealth are
- 25 contaminated by acid mine drainage, with many of the impacted
- 26 streams containing no fish; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Storm water runoff is another major source of water
- 28 pollution in this Commonwealth; and
- 29 WHEREAS, During rainstorms, litter, motor oil, antifreeze and
- 30 other chemicals, including salt used to treat roadways in the

- 1 winter, washes off roads and into storm drains, eventually
- 2 polluting our streams and rivers; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The Congress of the United States recently
- 4 overturned the United States Department of the Interior's Stream
- 5 Protection Rule, which regulated waterway contamination from
- 6 surface coal mining; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The Federal Government has sought to change the
- 8 definition of "waters of the United States" covered under the
- 9 Clean Water Act so that certain small streams, headwaters and
- 10 wetlands are no longer included; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The health of our waterways is crucial to the well-
- 12 being of this Commonwealth; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the
- 14 week of April 16 through 22, 2018, as "Clean Streams Week" in
- 15 Pennsylvania.
