A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating June 2014 as "Cancer Survivors Recognition Month" in
- 2 Pennsylvania and honoring all cancer survivors for their
- 3 strength and courage in the face of this devastating illness.
- 4 WHEREAS, The National Cancer Institute reports that
- 5 approximately 1.6 million new cases of cancer are expected to be
- 6 diagnosed in the United States in 2014; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society estimates that 79,920
- 8 new cases of cancer will be diagnosed in Pennsylvania in 2014;
- 9 and
- 10 WHEREAS, As a result of advances in early detection and
- 11 treatment, cancer has become a curable disease for some and a
- 12 chronic illness for many others; and
- 13 WHEREAS, A cancer survivor is anyone living with a history of

- 1 cancer from the moment of diagnosis through the remainder of
- 2 life; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society and the National Cancer
- 4 Institute estimate that 13.7 million Americans with a history of
- 5 cancer were alive in January 2012; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network
- 7 reports that there are 608,000 cancer survivors in Pennsylvania;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, Cancer survivors come in many forms: parent, child,
- 10 grandparent, family member, friend, co-worker, neighbor; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Cancer survivorship has three distinct phases:
- 12 living with cancer, living through cancer and living beyond
- 13 cancer; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Survivorship can be both stressful and hopeful.
- 15 Surviving cancer can leave a host of problems in its wake.
- 16 Physical, emotional and financial hardships often persist for
- 17 years after diagnosis and treatment; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Many cancer survivors are deeply grateful to their
- 19 caregivers, family, friends, health care providers and
- 20 communities for their love, dedication and support as they
- 21 battle cancer; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Despite the fear, the challenges and the setbacks,
- 23 life after a cancer diagnosis can be meaningful, productive and
- 24 even inspiring and triumphant; therefore be it
- 25 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate June
- 26 2014 as "Cancer Survivors Recognition Month" in Pennsylvania in
- 27 celebration of life; and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives honor all cancer
- 29 survivors and urge all citizens to pause to honor those who are
- 30 living with a history of cancer for their strength, courage and
