A RESOLUTION

- Recognizing the week of May 4 through 10, 2014, as "National Postcard Week" in Pennsylvania. 2
- WHEREAS, Long before the days of e-mail, social media and 3
- smart phones, postcards delivered scenes of faraway places and 4
- 5 greetings to family and friends across the country; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The United States Postal Service began to issue
- 7 plain, stamped mailing cards in 1873; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Within 20 years a company sold "souvenir cards,"
- which included a picture on the front and a space for the
- 10 address but no message on the back; and
- 11 WHEREAS, In 1907 the United States Postal Service allowed
- postcard designers to divide the back of postcards so that 12
- 13 people sending them could place both an address and a message on
- 14 them; and
- WHEREAS, For many people, postcards become keepsakes; and 15
- WHEREAS, Sending picture postcards through the mail in this 16

- 1 country is a custom participated in by millions of its citizens,
- 2 and collecting postcards has developed into a hobby for many
- 3 people; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The leisure pastime of collecting and studying
- 5 postcards, known as deltiology, has lead to the formation of 106
- 6 postcard clubs in the United States and more than 100 postcard
- 7 shows annually; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 9 week of May 4 through 10, 2014, as "National Postcard Week" in
- 10 Pennsylvania.
