## A RESOLUTION

1 2	Recognizing the week of May 1 through 7, 2016, as "National Travel and Tourism Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, The week of May 1 through 7, 2016, has been selected
4	as "National Travel and Tourism Week" by the U.S. Travel
5	Association; and
6	WHEREAS, "National Tourism Week" was established in 1983 when
7	the Congress of the United States passed a joint resolution
8	designating a week in May 1984 as "National Tourism Week" and,
9	in a White House ceremony, the President of the United States
10	signed a Presidential proclamation urging citizens to observe
11	the week with the appropriate ceremonies and activities; and
12	WHEREAS, Tourism is Pennsylvania's second-largest industry
13	and a major contributor to the economy of this Commonwealth,

1 accounting for an annual economic impact of \$42 billion; and 2 WHEREAS, Tourism supports a work force of more than 482,000 3 people, with 1 out of every 16 Pennsylvania jobs relying on 4 travel and tourism and related industries; and 5 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is one of the most visited states in 6 the country, with an estimated 190 million domestic visits
