A RESOLUTION

- Designating June 19, 2018, as "Rare Disease Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, There are approximately 1.2 million Pennsylvanians
- 4 who suffer from rare diseases and there are approximately 7,000
- 5 rare diseases afflicting nearly 30 million people in the United
- 6 States; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Children with rare genetic diseases account for more
- 8 than half of the population affected by rare diseases in the
- 9 United States; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Many rare diseases are serious and life-threatening
- 11 and lack an effective treatment; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Rare diseases include epidermolysis bullosa,
- 13 progeria, sickle cell anemia, Tay-Sachs, cystic fibrosis, many
- 14 childhood cancers and fibrodysplasia ossificans progressiva; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Individuals with rare diseases experience challenges

- 1 that include difficulty in obtaining an accurate diagnosis,
- 2 limited treatment options and difficulty finding physicians or
- 3 treatment centers with expertise in their disease; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Great strides have been made in research and
- 5 treatment for rare diseases as a result of the Orphan Drug Act;
- 6 and
- 7 WHEREAS, The United States Food and Drug Administration and
- 8 the National Institutes of Health have established special
- 9 offices to advocate for rare disease research and treatments;
- 10 and
- 11 WHEREAS, The National Organization for Rare Disorders is an
- 12 organization established in 1983 to provide services to patients
- 13 with rare diseases and advocate on behalf of patients with rare
- 14 diseases; and
- 15 WHEREAS, The National Organization for Rare Disorders was a
- 16 primary force behind the enactment of the Orphan Drug Act and
- 17 remains a critical public voice for people with rare diseases;
- 18 and
- 19 WHEREAS, The National Organization for Rare Disorders
- 20 sponsors "Rare Disease Day" in the United States to increase
- 21 public awareness of rare diseases; and
- 22 WHEREAS, "Rare Disease Day" has become a global event
- 23 occurring annually on the last day of February; therefore be it
- 24 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate June
- 25 19, 2018 as "Rare Disease Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it
- 26 further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives join millions of
- 28 people around the world in observing "Rare Disease Day" and
- 29 finding ways to work together to provide the different kinds of
- 30 care that people living with a rare disease need.
