A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the United States Department of Health and Human Services 2 to increase the allocation of COVID-19 vaccine doses sent to
- 3 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- WHEREAS, On March 6, 2020, the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 confirmed its first two cases of the novel coronavirus SARS-CoV2
- 6 (COVID-19); and
- 7 WHEREAS, At the beginning of the pandemic, the Commonwealth
- 8 of Pennsylvania experienced some of the worst outbreaks of
- 9 COVID-19 in the nation, which led Governor Tom Wolf to issue a
- 10 proclamation of disaster emergency on March 6, 2020; and
- 11 WHEREAS, As of March 6, 2021, the Department of Health
- 12 reported that the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania had 946,985 total
- 13 cases of COVID-19 and that 24,317 residents had died from COVID-
- 14 19; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Throughout the pandemic, the Commonwealth of
- 16 Pennsylvania has followed guidelines from the Centers for
- 17 Disease Control and Prevention in its efforts to mitigate the

- 1 risks posed by COVID-19; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Hospitals in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania began
- 3 receiving shipments of Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine the week of
- 4 December 14, 2020, Moderna COVID-19 vaccine the week of December
- 5 21, 2020, and Janssen COVID-19 vaccine the week of March 1,
- 6 2021; and
- WHEREAS, As of March 6, 2021, the Commonwealth of
- 8 Pennsylvania had administered over 2.9 million COVID-19 vaccine
- 9 doses, including 90% of its allocated first/single COVID-19
- 10 doses; and
- 11 WHEREAS, The vaccines for COVID-19 are a critical tool in
- 12 helping to stop the pandemic; and
- 13 WHEREAS, The current supply of COVID-19 vaccine doses the
- 14 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is receiving from the Federal
- 15 Government does not meet the Commonwealth's demand and is
- 16 insufficient to vaccinate even those individuals who are
- 17 currently eligible; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania requires additional
- 19 COVID-19 vaccine doses from the Federal Government to meet
- 20 demand and to ensure the health, safety and welfare of its
- 21 residents; therefore be it
- 22 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives of the
- 23 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the United States Department
- 24 of Health and Human Services to increase the allocation of
- 25 COVID-19 vaccine doses sent to the Commonwealth; and be it
- 26 further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives urge residents of
- 28 the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania to continue their vigilance in
- 29 combating the COVID-19 pandemic by following guidelines from the
- 30 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to
- 2 the President of the United States, the presiding officers of
- 3 each house of Congress and each member of Congress from
- 4 Pennsylvania.
