## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to suspend all 2 utility rate hikes through the end of 2020.
- 3 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is navigating uncharted territory as a
- 4 result of the global pandemic that plagues our Commonwealth and
- 5 this country; and
- 6 WHEREAS, In Pennsylvania, record unemployment rates have
- 7 resulted in the distribution of more than \$3.6 billion in
- 8 unemployment benefits through April 30, 2020; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Federal Reserve Bank in St. Louis is forecasting
- 10 that the unemployment rate in this nation could rise to 30%
- 11 during this pandemic; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The national unemployment rate was 25% during the
- 13 Great Depression; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has more than 1.7 million unemployed
- 15 workers and that number currently exceeds 22 million unemployed
- 16 workers nationally; and
- 17 WHEREAS, According to the United States Small Business

- 1 Administration Office of Advocacy, Pennsylvania is home to
- 2 nearly 1.1 million small businesses which employ more than 2.5
- 3 million workers; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The United States Small Business Administration
- 5 reported in 2016 that small business workers account for 46.6%
- 6 of the private sector workforce; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In addition to Federal small business loans and
- 8 payroll protection loans, Pennsylvania has given more than \$61
- 9 million in small business loans; and
- 10 WHEREAS, This assistance constitutes only a tiny amount of
- 11 what is needed to help small businesses recover in Pennsylvania;
- 12 and
- 13 WHEREAS, During this crisis, Pennsylvania families and
- 14 businesses are struggling and witnessing economic devastation;
- 15 and
- 16 WHEREAS, Various economic and safety measures to minimize the
- 17 impact of the pandemic have been implemented; and
- 18 WHEREAS, During recovery from this crisis, Pennsylvania must
- 19 undertake initiatives to assist unemployed and stressed
- 20 residents and our small businesses and provide them a chance to
- 21 outlast this pandemic; and
- 22 WHEREAS, Some utility companies are requesting astonishing
- 23 rate increases, as much as 24%, while families are struggling to
- 24 stay in their homes, and small businesses, nonprofit
- 25 organizations and educational institutions are fighting to carry
- 26 on through the current challenges; therefore be it
- 27 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives, recognizing the
- 28 proclamation of a pandemic emergency, urge the Pennsylvania
- 29 Public Utility Commission to suspend all utility rate hikes
- 30 through the end of 2020; and be it further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives, mindful that
- 2 many utility companies have had successive annual rate
- 3 increases, urge the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission to
- 4 freeze all requests for utility rate hikes through 2020.
