## A RESOLUTION

Directing the Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to 1 conduct a comprehensive review and issue a report of the 2 Department of Public Welfare, Office of Developmental Programs' implementation of the 1999 ruling by the Supreme Court of the United States in Olmstead v. L.C., relating to 5 the closure of State centers for people with intellectual disabilities and the provision of home-based and community-6 based services. 9 WHEREAS, Known as the 1999 Olmstead decision, in a landmark interpretation of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 10 11 (Public Law 101-336, 104 Stat. 327) (ADA), the Supreme Court of 12 the United States ruled that people with disabilities have a 13 right to receive care in the most integrated setting appropriate 14 and that unnecessary institutionalization violates the ADA; and WHEREAS, All states must comply with Olmstead and are 15 16 required to have an Olmstead Plan with measurable objectives 17 demonstrating how Olmstead will be implemented; and 18 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Welfare has not produced an 19 Olmstead Plan for the Office of Developmental Programs 20 demonstrating how the Commonwealth will move individuals with

- 1 intellectual disabilities out of State centers; and
- 2 WHEREAS, In fiscal year 2013-2014, 1,060 individuals with
- 3 intellectual disabilities were still residing in State centers;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, In fiscal year 2013-2014, 51,970 individuals with
- 6 intellectual disabilities were receiving home-based and
- 7 community-based services; and
- 8 WHEREAS, In fiscal year 2013-2014, the Department of Public
- 9 Welfare had allocated funds to move 100 individuals from the
- 10 State centers to the community; and
- 11 WHEREAS, From January 2013 through February 2014, 18
- 12 individuals have been moved from State centers into the
- 13 community; and
- 14 WHEREAS, From January 2013 through February 2014, eight
- 15 individuals with intellectual disabilities have been admitted to
- 16 one of the State centers; and
- WHEREAS, As of February 2014, 13,888 individuals with
- 18 intellectual disabilities are on the waiting list for home-based
- 19 and community-based services; therefore be it
- 20 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives request the
- 21 Legislative Budget and Finance Committee to conduct a
- 22 comprehensive review and issue a report on the Department of
- 23 Public Welfare, Office of Developmental Programs' implementation
- 24 of Olmstead as it relates to the closure of the five State
- 25 centers for people with intellectual disabilities and the
- 26 provision of home-based and community-based services; and be it
- 27 further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the report shall include the economic impact
- 29 of the closure of the State centers, the potential for economic
- 30 development of the five properties, opportunities for employees

- 1 in the post-closure environment and the potential to reinvest
- 2 post-closure financial savings in community-based supports for
- 3 people on the waiting list for intellectual disabilities
- 4 services; and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That the committee report to the House of
- 6 Representatives on its activities, findings and recommendations
- 7 by June 30, 2015, and issue interim reports to the House of
- 8 Representatives as the committee deems necessary.
