## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the 100th anniversary of Sheraden Park.
- 2 WHEREAS, The neighborhood of Sheraden traces its roots to
- 3 1856, when William Sheraden purchased 122 acres for use as
- 4 farmland; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Sheraden Borough was annexed by the City of
- 6 Pittsburgh in 1907; and
- 7 WHEREAS, In 1914, the City of Pittsburgh acquired and set
- 8 aside 23 acres of William Sheraden's original tract for use as a
- 9 greenspace; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The City of Pittsburgh paid the sum of \$14,500 for
- 11 this 23-acre tract; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Sheraden Park was established on this 23-acre tract;
- 13 and
- 14 WHEREAS, Sheraden Park was later expanded to its current size
- 15 of 51 acres; and
- 16 WHEREAS, The Sheraden Citizen's Improvement Council was
- 17 instrumental in refurbishing Sheraden Park in 1974; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Sheraden Park today offers a host of recreational
- 2 facilities, including picnic areas, ball fields, sports courts,
- 3 a swimming pool and playgrounds; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The 100th anniversary celebration of Sheraden Park
- 5 is planned for August 16, 2014; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize the
- 7 100th anniversary of Sheraden Park.
