A RESOLUTION

Recognizing March 14, 2015, as "Charter Day" in Pennsylvania. 1 2 WHEREAS, On March 4, 1681, King Charles II of England granted William Penn a charter for land in the New World to make up for 3 a large debt that the king owed to Penn's father; and 4 5 WHEREAS, William Penn had initially decided to name the land "Sylvania," which in Latin means "woods" and to which King 6 7 Charles II added the prefix "Penn" to the name in honor of William Penn's father, Admiral Sir William Penn, who had served 8 England as a rear admiral and vice admiral of Ireland, a vice 9 admiral of England, a general in the first Dutch War and great 10 11 captain commander under the Duke of York; and 12 WHEREAS, William Penn wrote a Frame of Government of 13 Pennsylvania that established a democratic system containing 14 full freedom of religion, fair trials featuring independent 15 juries, assemblies consisting of elected representatives of the

people and a separation of powers in the government, all ideas
 that later formed the crux of the Constitution of the United
 States; and

WHEREAS, William Penn therefore described Pennsylvania as his
"holy experiment" and from it, he hoped, a nation based on
justice would grow; and

7 WHEREAS, William Penn's charter exists as the formal 8 beginning of the colony and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and 9 through it William Penn established the first example of 10 democracy in what would become the United States of America; and 11 WHEREAS, Our citizens benefit from learning more about the overall history of this Commonwealth from its founding until 12 13 today and how the principles of governance within the 14 Commonwealth date back to the beliefs of William Penn; and 15 WHEREAS, The history of Pennsylvania, from its founding by 16 William Penn onward, exists as a kaleidoscope of stories and people with each area of this Commonwealth having multiple 17 18 stories of history involving key characters and events that 19 create and establish Pennsylvania's heritage; and 20 WHEREAS, The act of July 28, 1953 (P.L.676, No.210) provides for the observance of March 14 of each year as Charter Day and 21 urges the people of this Commonwealth, the public schools and 22 23 other educational institutions and patriotic, religious, 24 historical and veterans' organizations to observe on that day 25 the anniversary of the execution of the Royal Charter by King 26 Charles II; and

27 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, 28 the Pennsylvania State Archives and the State Historical Records 29 Advisory Board each works to inform our residents about the 30 Commonwealth's heritage, including sponsoring an annual Charter

Day event in the State Museum of Pennsylvania; and WHEREAS, This free event has included a presentation of the 1681 Charter as well as information about Penn's Great Law of 1682, the 1698 William Penn Family Bible, a William Penn reenactor, stories of Pennsylvania history and other programs; and

7 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has 23 other State historic sites and 8 museums and numerous other historical organizations that continue to operate, largely thanks to the assistance of 9 10 volunteers and other groups that have donated their money, time and other resources so that residents can remain well informed 11 about the fabric of this Commonwealth's history; therefore be it 12 13 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate March 14, 2015, as "Charter Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further 14 15 RESOLVED, That the residents, schools, other educational institutions and patriotic, religious, historical and veterans 16 groups be urged to participate with any and all Charter Day 17 18 activities sponsored by the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum 19 Commission, the Pennsylvania State Archives, the State 20 Historical Records Advisory Board, the 23 other State historic sites and museums or those offered by any of the many other 21 historical organizations within this Commonwealth; and be it 22 23 further

RESOLVED, That the volunteers and other residents who keep history alive through their support and work for the Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission, the Pennsylvania State Archives, the State Historical Records Advisory Board, the all other State historic sites and museums or through the numerous other historical organizations within this Commonwealth be honored for their efforts.
