INTRODUCED AS NONCONTROVERSIAL RESOLUTION UNDER RULE 35, AUGUST 18, 2020

A RESOLUTION

- Designating October 10, 2020, as "Put the Brakes on Fatalities Day" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, The number of highway deaths on Pennsylvania roads
- 4 totaled 1,059 in 2019, the lowest number since recordkeeping
- 5 began in 1928; and
- 6 WHEREAS, There are many controllable causes of traffic
- 7 fatalities, including excessive speed, use of alcohol and drugs,
- 8 inexperience, carelessness and distracted driving; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The National Society of Professional Engineers, the
- 10 National Academy of Forensic Engineers, the Institute of
- 11 Transportation Engineers Expert Witness Council and a coalition
- 12 of government agencies have teamed up to focus national public
- 13 awareness on October 10, 2020, on the cause of traffic
- 14 fatalities and the need to reduce the number of traffic
- 15 fatalities; and
- 16 WHEREAS, On "Put the Brakes on Fatalities Day," all drivers

- 1 should take an extra measure of care to ensure the safety of
- 2 themselves and others by:
- 3 (1) driving courteously and defensively;
- 4 (2) knowing the rules of the road for their method of
- 5 transportation and obeying all traffic laws;
- 6 (3) wearing protective gear, seat belts or helmets;
- 7 (4) avoiding speeding or driving while impaired or
- 8 driving aggressively; and
- 9 (5) avoiding talking or text messaging on cell phones
- 10 while driving;
- 11 therefore be it
- 12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate October
- 13 10, 2020, as "Put the Brakes on Fatalities Day" in Pennsylvania.
