A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the week of July 22 through July 28, 2018, as "Construction Opioids Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Drug overdoses claimed more than 64,000 lives in the
4	United States in 2016, more than double the number from a decade
5	earlier; and
6	WHEREAS, The Governor has declared the epidemic of heroin and
7	opioid addiction to be a Statewide disaster emergency; and
8	WHEREAS, The construction industry, which involves physically
9	demanding labor and employs an older workforce has been
10	particularly vulnerable to the opioid epidemic; and
11	WHEREAS, Some construction companies have reported
12	experiencing issues with drug abuse on a weekly basis; and
13	WHEREAS, Business insurer CNA reports more than 15% of
14	workers in the construction industry have a substance abuse
15	problem, compared to less than 9% of workers in other
16	industries; and

1 WHEREAS, Drug abuse issues in the construction industry 2 endanger not only the individual worker, but the companies they 3 work for, other workers on the job site and the general public; 4 and

5 WHEREAS, Summer is the busiest season for the construction 6 industry, and an ideal time for promoting awareness of the 7 dangers of opioid abuse in the industry; and

8 WHEREAS, The Keystone Contractors Association has partnered 9 with the National Safety Council to create an educational 10 toolbox for members of the construction industry, including materials to facilitate discussions with workers about the 11 dangers of opioids and prescription drug abuse, and "Warn Me" 12 13 stickers to place on workers' insurance cards in the hopes of 14 encouraging health care providers to discuss opioid issues with workers; and 15

16 WHEREAS, The following groups plan to join the Keystone Contractors Association and the National Safety Council in 17 18 promoting awareness of the dangers of opioids and prescription 19 drug abuse within the construction industry on an annual basis 20 during the last full week in July: NUCA PA Chapter, the Pennsylvania Building and Construction Trades Council, Keystone 21 Mountain Lakes Regional Council of Carpenters, SMACNA of 22 23 Pennsylvania, PBX, Architectural Glass & Metal Association, 24 Ironworker Employers Association of Western Pennsylvania and the 25 General Building Contractors Association; therefore be it 26 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the week of July 22 through July 28, 2018, as "Construction Opioids 27 28 Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania; and be it further 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage the 30 construction industry to promote awareness of the dangers of
