## A JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment SEPARATE AND DISTINCT AMENDMENTS to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for ACTION ON CONCURRENT ORDERS AND RESOLUTIONS AND <--FOR qualifications of electors. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby resolves as follows: 7 Section 1. The following amendment SEPARATE AND DISTINCT AMENDMENTS to the Constitution of Pennsylvania is ARE proposed 8 <-in accordance with Article XI: That section 1 of Article VII be amended to read: 10 <--THAT SECTION 9 OF ARTICLE III BE AMENDED TO READ: 11 (1)12 § 9. ACTION ON CONCURRENT ORDERS AND RESOLUTIONS. 13 EVERY ORDER, RESOLUTION OR VOTE, TO WHICH THE CONCURRENCE OF 14 BOTH HOUSES MAY BE NECESSARY, EXCEPT ON THE QUESTIONS OF 15 ADJOURNMENT, DISAPPROVAL OF A REGULATION OR TERMINATION OR 16 EXTENSION OF A DISASTER EMERGENCY DECLARATION AS DECLARED BY AN

EXECUTIVE ORDER OR PROCLAMATION, OR PORTION OF A DISASTER

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- 1 EMERGENCY DECLARATION AS DECLARED BY AN EXECUTIVE ORDER OR
- 2 PROCLAMATION, SHALL BE PRESENTED TO THE GOVERNOR AND BEFORE IT
- 3 SHALL TAKE EFFECT BE APPROVED BY HIM, OR BEING DISAPPROVED,
- 4 SHALL BE REPASSED BY TWO-THIRDS OF BOTH HOUSES ACCORDING TO THE
- 5 RULES AND LIMITATIONS PRESCRIBED IN CASE OF A BILL.
- 6 (2) THAT SECTION 1 OF ARTICLE VII BE AMENDED TO READ:
- 7 § 1. Oualifications of electors.
- 8 (a) Every citizen 21 years of age, possessing the following
- 9 qualifications, shall be entitled to vote at all elections
- 10 subject, however, to such laws requiring and regulating the
- 11 registration of electors as the General Assembly may enact.
- 12 1. He or she shall have been a citizen of the United States
- 13 at least one month.
- 14 2. He or she shall have resided in the State 90 days
- 15 immediately preceding the election.
- 16 3. He or she shall have resided in the election district
- 17 where he or she shall offer to vote at least 60 days immediately
- 18 preceding the election, except that if qualified to vote in an
- 19 election district prior to removal of residence, he or she may,
- 20 if a resident of Pennsylvania, vote in the election district
- 21 from which he or she removed his or her residence within 60 days
- 22 preceding the election.
- 23 (b) In addition to the qualifications under subsection (a)
- 24 of this section, a qualified elector shall provide a valid
- 25 identification at each election in accordance with the
- 26 following:
- 27 <u>1. When voting in person, the qualified elector shall</u>
- 28 present a valid identification before receiving a ballot to vote
- 29 <u>in person.</u>
- 30 2. When not voting in person, the qualified elector shall

- 1 provide proof of a valid identification with his or her ballot.
- 2 (c) If a qualified elector does not possess a valid
- 3 identification, he or she shall, upon request and confirmation
- 4 of identity, be furnished with a government-issued
- 5 <u>identification at no cost to the qualified elector.</u>
- 6 (d) For purposes of this section, the term "valid
- 7 <u>identification" means an unexpired government-issued</u>
- 8 <u>identification</u>, unless otherwise provided for by law.
- 9 Section 2. The following procedure applies to the proposed <--
- 10 constitutional amendment in this joint resolution:
- 11 (1) Upon the first passage by the General Assembly of
- 12 the amendment, the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall
- 13 proceed immediately to comply with the advertising
- 14 requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution
- 15 of Pennsylvania.
- 16 (2) Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of
- the amendment, the Secretary of the Commonwealth shall
- 18 proceed immediately to comply with the advertising
- 19 requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution
- 20 of Pennsylvania. The Secretary of the Commonwealth shall-
- 21 submit the amendment to the qualified electors of this-
- 22 Commonwealth at the first primary, general or municipal
- 23 election which meets the requirements of section 1 of Article
- 24 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania.
- 25 SECTION 2. THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURE APPLIES TO THE PROPOSED <-
- 26 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS IN THIS JOINT RESOLUTION:
- 27 (1) UPON FIRST PASSAGE BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
- 28 AMENDMENTS, THE SECRETARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH SHALL PROCEED
- 29 IMMEDIATELY TO COMPLY WITH THE ADVERTISING REQUIREMENTS OF
- 30 SECTION 1 OF ARTICLE XI OF THE CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA.

(2) UPON THE SECOND PASSAGE OF THE AMENDMENTS BY THE
GENERAL ASSEMBLY, THE SECRETARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH SHALL
PROCEED IMMEDIATELY TO COMPLY WITH THE ADVERTISING
REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 1 OF ARTICLE XI OF THE CONSTITUTION
OF PENNSYLVANIA. THE SECRETARY OF THE COMMONWEALTH SHALL:

- (I) SUBMIT THE AMENDMENT UNDER SECTION 1(1) OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THIS COMMONWEALTH AS A SEPARATE BALLOT QUESTION AT THE FIRST PRIMARY ELECTION WHICH MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 1 OF ARTICLE XI OF THE CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA.
- (II) SUBMIT THE AMENDMENT UNDER SECTION 1(2) OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THIS COMMONWEALTH AS A SEPARATE BALLOT QUESTION AT THE FIRST PRIMARY ELECTION WHICH MEETS THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 1 OF ARTICLE XI OF THE CONSTITUTION OF PENNSYLVANIA.
