AN ACT

1 2 3	Providing for the declaration of a public health emergency, for duties of the Department of Health, for temporary regulations and for immunity from liability.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Public Health
8	Emergency Act.
9	Section 2. Definitions.
10	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
11	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
12	context clearly indicates otherwise:
13	"Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
14	"Executive agency." A department, board, commission,
15	authority, officer or agency or the Executive Department,
16	subject to the policy, supervision and control of the Governor.
17	"Government agency." Any of the following:
18	(1) An agency of the Commonwealth, including

1 departments, boards, commissions or authorities. 2 (2) A political subdivision or agency of a political subdivision. 3 A local or municipal authority or other local 4 (3) 5 government unit. (4) A court or related agency. 6 "Public health emergency." An occurrence or imminent threat 7 8 of a disease or condition of public health importance with both of the following characteristics: 9 10 Is believed to be caused by any of the following: (1) A bioterrorist event, a biological, chemical or 11 (i) 12 nuclear agent, a chemical attack or a nuclear attack. 13 (ii) The appearance of a novel or previously 14 controlled or eradicated infectious agent or biological toxin. 15 A natural disaster, an accidental chemical 16 (iii) 17 release or a nuclear incident. 18 (iv) A disease outbreak or unusual expression of 19 illness. 20 (2) Poses a high probability of any of the following in 21 the affected population: 22 (i) Death. 23 (ii) Serious or long-term disabilities. 24 Widespread exposure to an infectious or toxic (iii) 25 agent that poses a significant risk of substantial 26 present or future harm to the public health. 27 "Public health worker." A person employed by, under contract 28 with or serving as a registered volunteer of the department or a 29 local health department to carry out prophylaxis, treatment, notification and prevention services to individuals AT RISK OF 30 <---20180SB1001PN1892 - 2 -

1 CONTRACTING, OR reported to the department or local health 2 departments as having, a reportable disease under the act of <---April 23, 1956 (1955 P.L.1510, No.500), known as the Disease 3 Prevention and Control Law of 1955. 4

5 "Secretary." The Secretary of Health of the Commonwealth. Section 3. Declaration of a public health emergency. 6

(a) Authorization.--

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8 (1)The GOVERNOR, ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF THE <---9 secretary, may declare a public health emergency by <---10 disseminating the declaration promptly by means calculated to 11 bring its contents to the attention of the general public and 12 shall file it with the Legislative Reference Bureau for 13 publication under 45 Pa.C.S. Pt. II (relating to publication 14 and effectiveness of Commonwealth documents) and with the 15 director of the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency.

16 Within 72 hours of receipt of a declaration under (2)17 paragraph (1), the director shall convene the emergency 18 council to perform its duties under 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 73 19 (relating to Commonwealth services) and consistent with 20 disaster declarations issued by the Governor.

21 (b) Declaration.--The declaration of a public health 22 emergency shall be valid for a period of up to 90 days unless 23 renewed or terminated by the GOVERNOR, ON THE RECOMMENDATION OF <---24 THE secretary, by publishing a subsequent declaration in the <---25 Pennsylvania Bulletin.

26 Duties of department. -- Upon a declaration under (C) 27 subsection (a), the department is authorized to perform the 28 following duties:

29 Suspend departmental regulations. (1)

30 (2)Promulgate temporary regulations under subsection 20180SB1001PN1892

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1 (f) to address the public health emergency.

2 (3) Require reporting, in the manner and form prescribed
3 by the department, relating to a disease, infection or
4 condition.

5 (4) Set forth the requirements for health care
6 facilities and licensed health care practitioners, INCLUDING <--
7 PHARMACISTS, to manage a disease outbreak or unusual
8 expression of illness.

9 (5) Authorize public health workers to dispense, <---10 administer, furnish or otherwise provide prescription 11 medication for prophylaxis or treatment of a reportable-12 disease or condition as necessary to prevent and control the-13 spread of disease or condition. AUTHORIZE APPROPRIATELY <---14 TRAINED, LICENSED OR CERTIFIED PUBLIC HEALTH WORKERS TO 15 DISPENSE, ADMINISTER, FURNISH OR OTHERWISE PROVIDE PROPHYLAXIS OR TREATMENT FOR A REPORTABLE DISEASE OR 16 17 CONDITION AS NECESSARY TO PREVENT AND CONTROL THE SPREAD OF 18 DISEASE OR CONDITION.

19 Requirements. -- Notwithstanding any other provision of (d) 20 law, all government agencies shall, at the request of the 21 department and to the extent not prohibited by Federal law, provide information as prescribed by the department during a 22 23 public health emergency. The department shall provide for the 24 frequency and format, which may include automated data 25 exchanges, for the collection of the information required under 26 this subsection.

(e) Confidentiality of information.--Any information
 provided or collected under this section, EXCEPT FOR
 NONIDENTIFIABLE AGGREGATED DATA, shall be confidential and is
 not subject to public access under the act of February 14, 2008

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(P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law, and is neither
 discoverable nor admissible as evidence in any civil, criminal
 or administrative action or proceeding.

4 (f) Temporary regulations.--The department may promulgate
5 temporary regulations regarding measures to reduce harm and
6 control disease. The temporary regulations are not subject to:

7 (1) Sections 201, 202, 203, 204 and 205 of the act of
8 July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the
9 Commonwealth Documents Law.

10 (2) Section 204(b) of the act of October 15, 1980
11 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth Attorneys Act.

12 (3) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as13 the Regulatory Review Act.

(g) Expiration and subsequent promulgation.--The temporary regulations promulgated under subsection (f) shall expire 90 days following the expiration or termination of the declaration of a public health emergency. Regulations adopted after this period shall be promulgated as provided by law.

(h) Suspension of regulations.--An executive agency, in consultation with the department, may suspend a regulation that prevents, hinders or delays necessary action in responding to a public health emergency.

23 Section 4. Immunity from liability.

The provisions of 42 Pa.C.S. § 8331 (relating to medical good Samaritan civil immunity), 8332 (relating to emergency response provider and bystander good Samaritan civil immunity) or 8332.4 (relating to volunteer-in-public-service negligence standard) shall apply to any person who provides assistance in carrying out the provisions of this act.

30 Section 5. Prohibitions.

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1 The prohibitions under 18 Pa.C.S. § 6107 (relating to 2 prohibited conduct during emergency) do not apply to a 3 declaration of a public health emergency under this act. 4 Section 6. Effective date.

5 This act shall take effect immediately.
