AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in student supports, providing for
- 6 bell-to-bell phone-free policy.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 1314-A. Bell-to-bell phone-free policy.--(a) No</u>
- 13 later than the start of the $\frac{2026-2027}{2027-2028}$ school year, the <--
- 14 governing body of each school entity shall adopt a policy
- 15 related to student possession and use of mobile devices during
- 16 the school day while on school property.
- 17 (b) (1) Except as provided under subsection (c), consistent
- 18 with the provisions of this section, the governing body of a
- 19 school entity shall adopt a policy relating to mobile devices

- 1 and shall:
- 2 (i) prohibit the use of a mobile device during the school
- 3 <u>day while on school property; and</u>
- 4 (ii) establish the manner in which a student's possession of
- 5 a mobile device is to be restricted during the school day while
- 6 <u>on school property.</u>
- 7 (2) The policy shall include appropriate enforcement and
- 8 oversight provisions to ensure compliance at a school building.
- 9 (3) At the beginning of each school year and upon
- 10 enrollment, each school entity shall provide written
- 11 notification to parents and legal guardians of students enrolled
- 12 in the school entity of the methods for a parent or legal
- 13 guardian to contact their child during the school day and
- 14 <u>information on how to sign up for emergency notifications.</u>
- 15 Methods for a parent or legal guardian to contact their child
- 16 during the school day may include, but not be limited to, the
- 17 school building phone number or an electronic mail address. The
- 18 school entity shall ensure that the phone number is staffed. ANY_<--
- 19 METHOD OF CONTACT PROVIDED TO PARENTS AND LEGAL GUARDIANS UNDER
- 20 THIS PARAGRAPH IS STAFFED DURING THE SCHOOL DAY.
- 21 (c) A school entity's policy shall include exceptions to
- 22 allow limited use of a mobile device during the school day by a
- 23 student who:
- 24 (1) Requires a mobile device due to a student's medical
- 25 condition, documented by a medical provider.
- 26 (2) Has an individualized education plan PROGRAM or 504
- 27 <u>service agreement in which a mobile device is part of the</u>
- 28 accommodations or services provided to the student.
- 29 <u>(3) Is an English learner and uses a mobile device for</u>
- 30 translation or other English as a second language purposes.

- 1 (4) Is instructed to do so by a teacher as an instructional
- 2 tool with the approval of a school building principal, provided
- 3 that:
- 4 <u>(i) a school-issued device is insufficient or unavailable</u>
- 5 for the instructional purposes needed by the teacher;
- 6 (ii) the principal determines that the use of the mobile
- 7 device is necessary for instructional purposes; and
- 8 (iii) the approval is for a limited circumstance and
- 9 <u>duration and does not permit the use of a mobile device as a</u>
- 10 regular part of instruction.
- 11 (d) Prior to the adoption by the governing body of a school
- 12 entity's policy OR AMENDING AN EXISTING POLICY, the governing <--
- 13 body of the school entity shall have a public comment period <--
- 14 which shall provide for an opportunity for feedback from:
- 15 (1) ENSURE THE OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT, INCLUDING <--
- 16 FEEDBACK FROM:
- 17 (1) Parents (I) PARENTS or legal quardians of students <--
- 18 attending the school entity-;
- 19 (2) Employes (II) EMPLOYES and any employe organization <--

- 20 representing employes of the school entity-; AND
- 21 (III) STUDENTS ATTENDING THE SCHOOL ENTITY; AND
- 22 (2) BE ENCOURAGED TO ENGAGE STUDENTS, PARENTS, LEGAL
- 23 GUARDIANS, EMPLOYES, EMPLOYE ORGANIZATIONS AND MEMBERS OF THE
- 24 COMMUNITY IN A STAKEHOLDER PROCESS THROUGH WHICH THE GOVERNING
- 25 BODY OF THE SCHOOL ENTITY MAY OBTAIN INPUT THAT THE GOVERNING
- 26 BODY MAY INCORPORATE INTO THE SCHOOL ENTITY'S POLICY.
- 27 (e) The governing body of a school entity that adopted a
- 28 policy relating to mobile devices prior to the effective date of
- 29 this section shall, no later than the start of the $\frac{2026-2027}{}$ <
- 30 2027-2028 school year, amend the existing policy, if needed, to <--

- 1 comply with the requirements of this section.
- 2 (f) (1) Each school entity shall post the school entity's
- 3 policy on the school entity's publicly accessible Internet
- 4 website no later than five (5) business days after adoption. If
- 5 <u>a school entity amends the policy after adoption, the amended</u>
- 6 policy shall be posted on the school entity's publicly
- 7 <u>accessible Internet website within five (5) business days.</u>
- 8 (2) No later than five (5) business days after posting a
- 9 copy of the policy or amended policy as required under paragraph
- 10 (1), a school entity shall submit documentation to the
- 11 <u>department verifying that a copy of the school entity's policy</u>
- 12 <u>or amended policy is posted on the school entity's publicly</u>
- 13 <u>accessible Internet website.</u>
- 14 (g) (1) No later than August 1, 2028, and each August 1
- 15 <u>thereafter</u>, utilizing existing data available, including data
- 16 <u>from the Pennsylvania Youth Survey, the department shall report</u>
- 17 on the impact that implementation of bell to bell phone free
- 18 policies have on student discipline, mental health, school
- 19 <u>attendance and academic performance. The department shall make</u>
- 20 the report available on the department's publicly accessible
- 21 Internet website.
- 22 (2) The department shall post copies of each school entity's
- 23 <u>policy on its publicly accessible Internet website.</u>
- 24 (h) (G) As used in this section:
- 25 "504 service agreement" shall have the meaning as defined in

- 27 "Department" shall mean the Department of Education of the
- 28 Commonwealth.
- 29 "Employe organization" shall have the meaning given to it in
- 30 section 1101-A.

- 1 <u>"Individualized education plan PROGRAM" shall mean an</u>
- 2 <u>individualized education plan PROGRAM developed in accordance</u>

- 3 with 22 Pa. Code § 14.131 (relating to IEP) and the Individuals
- 4 with Disabilities Education Act (Public Law 91-230, 20 U.S.C. §
- 5 <u>1400 et seq.).</u>
- 6 "Mobile device" shall mean a personal mobile telephone or
- 7 other portable electronic device capable of connecting to the
- 8 <u>Internet and enabling the user to access content on the</u>
- 9 <u>Internet</u>, that is not owned by a school entity or issued by a
- 10 school entity to a student. A mobile device shall include a
- 11 <u>device with which a user could engage in a call; write, send or</u>
- 12 receive a message; send or receive data or an image; record,
- 13 play or edit audio or video data; play a game; or watch a video.
- 14 The term does not include a portable device which meets the
- 15 <u>definition of a medical device under 21 U.S.C. § 321 (relating</u>
- 16 to definitions generally).
- 17 "Policy" shall mean a policy adopted by the governing body of
- 18 a school entity under subsection (a) or amended under subsection
- 19 (e) related to student possession and use of mobile devices
- 20 during the school day while on school property.
- 21 <u>"School day" shall mean the entirety of every instructional</u>
- 22 day during all instructional and non-instructional time, as
- 23 determined by the governing body of the school entity, including
- 24 homeroom periods, lunch, recess and the time moving between
- 25 <u>classes.</u>
- 26 "School entity" shall mean a school district, intermediate
- 27 <u>unit, area career and technical school, charter school, regional</u>
- 28 charter school or cyber charter school operating in this
- 29 Commonwealth.
- 30 "School property" shall mean any public school grounds or

- 1 <u>school-sponsored activity.</u>
- 2 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
