REFERRED TO CONSUMER PROTECTION AND PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE, DECEMBER 11, 2023

## AN ACT

Amending the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), entitled "An 1 act licensing and regulating the practice of social work; 2 providing penalties; and making an appropriation," further 3 providing for definitions, for license required, for State 4 Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and 5 Professional Counselors, for powers and functions of board, 6 for qualifications for license, for procedures for licensing, for reciprocity, for endorsement of out-of-State licenses and 7 8 for reinstatement of license; providing for restrictions on 9 use of title "Licensed Associate Marriage and Family 10 Therapist" and for restrictions on the use of title "Licensed 11 Associate Professional Counselor"; further providing for 12 license renewal and records and fees and for unlawful 13 practice; and providing for effect of associate licensure. 14 15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 16 hereby enacts as follows: 17 Section 1. Section 3 of the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220, No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family 18 19 Therapists and Professional Counselors Act, is amended by adding 20 definitions to read: 21 Section 3. Definitions. 22 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 23 24 context clearly indicates otherwise:

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2	"Licensed associate marriage and family therapist." An
3	individual licensed as an associate marriage and family
4	therapist under this act who is obtaining supervised clinical
5	experience for the purpose of becoming a licensed marriage and
6	family therapist.
7	"Licensed associate professional counselor." An individual
8	licensed as an associate professional counselor under this act
9	who is obtaining supervised clinical experience for the purpose
10	of becoming a licensed professional counselor.
11	* * *
12	"Practice of associate marriage and family therapy." The
13	professional application of psychotherapeutic and family system
14	theories and techniques to the evaluation, assessment, diagnosis
15	and treatment of mental and emotional disorders, whether
16	cognitive, affective or behavioral, while under the supervision
17	of a licensed supervisor acceptable to the board in accordance
18	with the board's regulations. The term includes the evaluation
19	and assessment of mental and emotional disorders in the context
20	of significant interpersonal relationships and the delivery of
21	psychotherapeutic services to individuals, couples, families and
22	groups for the purpose of treating the disorders.
23	"Practice of associate professional counseling." Includes,
24	to the extent compatible with a practitioner's education and
25	professional competence while under the supervision of a
26	licensed supervisor acceptable to the board in accordance with
27	the board's regulations, all of the following:
28	(1) The application of principles and practices of
29	counseling, mental health and human development to evaluate
30	and facilitate human growth and adjustment throughout the

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life span and to prevent and treat mental, emotional or 1 behavioral disorders and associated stresses which interfere 2 with mental health and normal human growth and development. 3 (2) The evaluation, assessment, diagnosis and treatment 4 of normal and abnormal mental, emotional, social, 5 educational, vocational, family and behavioral functioning 6 throughout the life span; individual, group, family 7 8 counseling and psychotherapy; crisis intervention, career counseling and educational and vocational counseling; 9 10 functional assessment of persons with disabilities; and 11 professional consulting. 12 (3) Professional counselors' utilization of verbal and 13 nonverbal approaches and specialization in the use of arts-14 based therapeutic approaches, such as art, dance, music or drama, to accomplish treatment objectives. 15 \* \* \* 16 17 Section 2. Sections 4, 5(1) and 6(2) and (3) of the act are 18 amended to read: 19 Section 4. License required. 20 It shall be unlawful for any person to hold [himself or herself] oneself forth as a licensed bachelor social worker, 21 licensed social worker, licensed clinical social worker, 22 licensed associate marriage and family therapist, licensed 23 marriage and family therapist, <u>licensed associate professional</u> 24 25 counselor or licensed professional counselor unless he or she shall first have obtained a license pursuant to this act. 26 27 Section 5. State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family 28 Therapists and Professional Counselors. \* \* \* 29 (1) Operating procedures. -- The board shall meet within 30 30

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days after the appointment of its new members and set up 1 2 operating procedures and develop application forms for licensing 3 clinical social workers, associate marriage and family therapists, marriage and family therapists, associate 4 professional counselors and professional counselors. It shall be 5 the responsibility of the board to circulate these forms and 6 7 educate the public to the requirements of licensing in order to 8 hold oneself out as a licensed bachelor social worker, licensed social worker, licensed associate marriage and family therapist, 9 10 licensed clinical social worker, licensed marriage and family 11 therapist, licensed associate professional counselor or licensed 12 professional counselor within the Commonwealth. Section 6. Powers and functions of board. 13 14 The board shall have the following powers: 15 \* \* \* 16

To adopt and, from time to time, revise such rules (2) 17 and regulations as may be necessary to carry into effect the 18 provisions of this act. Such regulations may include, but 19 shall not be limited to, standards of professional practice 20 and conduct for licensed bachelor social workers, licensed 21 social workers, licensed clinical social workers, licensed 22 associate marriage and family therapists, licensed marriage 23 and family therapists, licensed associate professional 24 counselors and licensed professional counselors in 25 Pennsylvania.

(3) To examine for, deny, approve, issue, revoke,
suspend or renew licenses of bachelor social workers, social
workers, clinical social workers, <u>associate marriage and</u>
<u>family therapists</u>, marriage and family therapists, <u>associate</u>
<u>professional counselors</u> and professional counselors pursuant

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1 to this act and to conduct hearings in connection therewith. \* \* \* 2 Section 3. Section 7(a)(1), (d)(1), (e)(1), (f)(1) and (g) 3 4 (1) of the act are amended and the section is amended by adding subsections to read: 5 Section 7. Qualifications for license. 6 Social work license. -- An applicant shall be qualified 7 (a) for a license to hold oneself out as a licensed social worker, 8 provided he or she submits proof satisfactory to the board that: 9 He or she is of good moral character. In assessing 10 (1) 11 the moral character of an applicant with a criminal conviction, the board shall conduct an individualized 12 assessment in accordance with 63 Pa.C.S. § 3113 (relating to 13 14 consideration of criminal convictions). 15 \* \* \* 16 (d) Clinical social work license. -- An applicant shall be qualified for a license to hold oneself out as a licensed 17 18 clinical social worker if the applicant submits proof 19 satisfactory to the board that all of the following apply: 20 The applicant is of good moral character. In (1) 21 assessing the moral character of an applicant with a criminal 22 conviction, the board shall conduct an individualized 23 assessment in accordance with 63 Pa.C.S. § 3113. \* \* \* 24 25 (e) Marriage and family therapist license.--An applicant shall be qualified to hold oneself out as a licensed marriage 26 27 and family therapist if the applicant submits proof satisfactory to the board that all of the following apply: 28 29 The applicant is of good moral character. In (1)assessing the moral character of an applicant with a criminal 30

4	(e.1) Associate marriage and family therapist license
5	(1) An applicant shall be qualified for a license to
6	hold oneself out as a licensed associate marriage and family
7	therapist if the applicant submits proof satisfactory to the
8	board that all of the following apply:
9	(i) The applicant is at least 21 years of age.
10	(ii) The applicant is of good moral character. In
11	assessing the moral character of an applicant with a
12	criminal conviction, the board shall conduct an
13	individualized assessment in accordance with 63 Pa.C.S. §
14	<u>3113.</u>
15	(iii) The applicant has satisfied the educational
16	requirements under subsection (e)(2)(i), (ii) or (iii).
17	(iv) The applicant has submitted a supervision plan,
18	including a detailed job description and each location
19	where client contact and supervision will occur.
20	(v) The applicant has submitted the resume or
21	curriculum vitae for each licensee who provides
22	supervision acceptable to the board. A supervisor shall
23	hold a current and active license to practice marriage
24	and family therapy or to practice in a related field as
25	approved by the board and shall have no less than five
26	full-time years of experience or the equivalent in the
27	prior ten years as specified by the board's regulations.
28	(vi) The applicant has submitted an application
29	accompanied by the application fee.
30	(vii) The applicant has not been convicted of a

1	felony under The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and
2	Cosmetic Act, or of an offense under the laws of another
3	jurisdiction, which, if committed in this Commonwealth,
4	would be a felony under The Controlled Substance, Drug,
5	Device and Cosmetic Act, unless:
6	(A) at least ten years have elapsed from the
7	date of conviction;
8	(B) the applicant satisfactorily demonstrates to

	the board that the applicant has made significant
10	progress in personal rehabilitation since the

19	<u>shall include a judgment, an admission of guilt or a</u>
20	<u>plea of nolo contendere.</u>
21	(2) Renewal of an associate marriage and family
22	therapist license shall be on a biennial basis, and the
23	license shall be eligible for no more than three renewals.
24	(e.2) Limitations on associate marriage and family_
25	therapist licenseA licensed associate marriage and family
26	therapist shall work under the supervision of a licensed
27	marriage and family therapist or a related licensed professional
28	as approved by the board who directs the activities of the
29	licensed associate marriage and family therapist. A licensed
30	associate marriage and family therapist shall not practice in a
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1	private setting without the direction of a supervisor. Nothing
2	in this section shall be construed to prohibit a licensed
3	associate marriage and family therapist from taking the required
4	examination under subsection (e)(4) during the time between
5	graduation and completing the required clinical supervised hours
6	under subsection (e)(3) to meet the licensure requirements for a
7	marriage and family therapist.
8	(f) Professional counselors licenseAn applicant is
9	qualified for a license to hold oneself out as a licensed
10	professional counselor if the applicant submits proof
11	satisfactory to the board that all of the following apply:
12	(1) The applicant is of good moral character. <u>In</u>
13	assessing the moral character of an applicant with a criminal
14	conviction, the board shall conduct an individualized
15	assessment in accordance with 63 Pa.C.S. § 3113.
16	* * *
17	(f.1) Associate professional counselor license
18	(1) An applicant is qualified for a license to hold
19	oneself out as a licensed associate professional counselor if
20	the applicant submits proof satisfactory to the board that
21	all of the following apply:
22	(i) The applicant is at least 21 years of age.
23	(ii) The applicant is of good moral character. In
24	assessing the moral character of an applicant with a
25	criminal conviction, the board shall conduct an
26	individualized assessment in accordance with 63 Pa.C.S. §
27	<u>3113.</u>
28	(iii) The applicant has satisfied the educational
29	requirements under subsection (f)(2)(i), (ii) or (iii).
30	(iv) The applicant has submitted a plan of

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1 supervision, including a detailed job description and each location where client contact and supervision will 2 3 occur. (v) The applicant has submitted the resume or 4 5 curriculum vitae for each licensee who provides supervision acceptable to the board. A supervisor shall 6 7 hold a current and active license to practice 8 professional counseling or to practice in a related field as approved by the board and shall have no less than five 9 10 full-time years of experience or the equivalent in the 11 prior ten years as specified by the board's regulations. 12 (vi) The application has been accompanied by the 13 application fee. (vii) The applicant has not been convicted of a 14 felony under The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and 15 16 Cosmetic Act or of an offense under the laws of another jurisdiction which if committed in this Commonwealth 17 18 would be a felony under The Controlled Substance, Drug, 19 Device and Cosmetic Act, unless: 20 (A) at least ten years have elapsed from the 21 date of conviction; 22 (B) the applicant satisfactorily demonstrates to 23 the board that the applicant has made significant 24 progress in personal rehabilitation since the 25 conviction such that licensure of the applicant 26 should not be expected to create a substantial risk of harm to the health and safety of clients or the 27 public or a substantial risk of further criminal 28 29 violations; and 30 (C) the applicant otherwise satisfies the

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1	qualifications contained in or authorized by this
2	act. As used in this paragraph, the term "convicted"
3	includes a judgment, an admission of guilt or a plea
4	<u>of nolo contendere.</u>
5	(2) Renewal of an associate professional counselor
6	license shall be on a biennial basis, and the license shall
7	be eligible for no more than three renewals.
8	(f.2) Limitations on associate professional counselor
9	licenseA licensed associate professional counselor shall work
10	under the supervision of a licensed professional counselor or a
11	related licensed professional approved by the board who directs
12	the activities of the licensed associate professional counselor.
13	<u>A licensed associate professional counselor shall not practice</u>
14	in a private setting without the direction of a
15	supervisor. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to
16	prohibit a licensed associate professional counselor from taking
17	the required exam under subsection (f)(4) during the time
18	between graduation and completing the required supervised hours
19	under subsection (f)(3) to meet the licensure requirements for a
20	licensed professional counselor.
21	(g) Bachelor social work licenseAn applicant shall be
22	qualified for a license to hold oneself out as a licensed
23	bachelor social worker if the applicant submits proof
24	satisfactory to the board that:
25	(1) The applicant is of good moral character. <u>In</u>
26	assessing the moral character of an applicant with a criminal
27	conviction, the board shall conduct an individualized
28	assessment in accordance with 63 Pa.C.S. § 3113.

30	Section 4. Sections 8(b), 10(a), 10.1(a)(1), (b)(1) and (c)

2 Section 8. Procedures for licensing.

3 \* \* \*

Issuance of license.--The board shall issue to each 4 (b) person who meets the licensure requirements of this act a 5 certificate setting forth that such person is licensed to hold 6 7 [himself or herself] <u>oneself</u> out as a licensed bachelor social 8 worker, a licensed social worker, a licensed clinical social worker, a licensed associate marriage and family therapist, a 9 10 licensed marriage and family therapist, <u>a licensed associate</u> professional counselor or a licensed professional counselor. 11 12 Section 10. Reciprocity.

(a) General rule.--The board shall have the power to grant a 13 14 reciprocal license to an applicant who is licensed or certified 15 as a bachelor social worker, social worker, clinical social 16 worker, associate marriage and family therapist, marriage and family therapist, associate professional counselor or 17 18 professional counselor in another state and has demonstrated 19 qualifications which equal or exceed those required pursuant to 20 this act in the determination of the board, provided that no license shall be granted under this section to an applicant 21 unless the state in which the applicant is licensed affords 22 23 reciprocal treatment to persons who are residents of this 24 Commonwealth and who are licensed pursuant to this act.

26 Section 10.1. Endorsement of out-of-State licenses.

(a) Clinical social work license.--The board may issue a
clinical social work license without examination to an applicant
holding a clinical social work license in another state who
submits proof satisfactory to the board of all of the following:

2	assessing the moral character of an applicant with a criminal
3	conviction, the board shall conduct an individualized

7	(b) Marriage and family therapist licenseThe board may
8	issue a marriage and family therapist license without
9	examination to an applicant holding a marriage and family
10	therapist license in another state who submits proof
11	satisfactory to the board of all of the following:
12	(1) The applicant is of good moral character. <u>In</u>
13	assessing the moral character of an applicant with a criminal
14	conviction, the board shall conduct an individualized
15	assessment in accordance with 63 Pa.C.S. § 3113.

17	(c) Professional counselor licenseThe board may issue a
18	professional counselor license without examination to an
19	applicant holding a professional counselor license in another
20	state who submits proof satisfactory to the board of all of the
21	following:
22	(1) The applicant is of good moral character. <u>In</u>
23	assessing the moral character of an applicant with a criminal
24	conviction, the board shall conduct an individualized
25	assessment in accordance with 63 Pa.C.S. § 3113.
26	* * *
27	Section 12. Reinstatement of license.
28	Unless ordered to do so by Commonwealth Court or an appeal
29	therefrom, the board shall not reinstate the license of a person

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social worker, associate marriage and family therapist, marriage 1 2 and family therapist, associate professional counselor or 3 professional counselor pursuant to this act, which has been revoked. Any person whose license has been revoked may apply for 4 reinstatement, after a period of at least five years, but must 5 meet all of the licensing qualifications of this act, including 6 7 the examination requirement, if he or she desires to practice as 8 a bachelor social worker, social worker, clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist or professional counselor pursuant 9 10 to this act at any time after such revocation. 11 Section 5. The act is amended by adding sections to read: 12 Section 16.5. 9 (b) Records.--A record of all persons licensed to practice 10 as bachelor social workers, social workers, clinical social 11 workers, <u>associate marriage and family therapists</u>, marriage and 12 family therapists, <u>associate professional counselors</u> and 13 professional counselors in Pennsylvania shall be kept in the 14 office of the board and and copying upon payment of a nominal 15 fee for copying the record.

17 Section 20. Unlawful practice.

18 (a) Unlawful practice prohibited.--It shall be unlawful for 19 any person to engage in the independent practice of clinical 20 social work, the independent practice of marriage and family therapy or the independent practice of professional counseling 21 or hold [himself or herself] <u>oneself</u> out as a licensed bachelor 22 23 social worker, licensed social worker, licensed clinical social 24 worker, licensed associate marriage and family therapist, 25 marriage and family therapist, licensed associate professional\_ counselor and professional counselor without possessing a valid, 26 27 unexpired, unrevoked and unsuspended license issued under this 28 act.

5	No.338), known as the Workers' Compensation Act, or for new or
6	additional policies written under or for any of the following:

9	(2) The act of December 29, 1972 (P.L.1701, No.364),
10	known as the Health Maintenance Organization Act.
11	(3) The act of May 18, 1976 (P.L.123, No.54), known as

14	(4) A nonprofit corporation subject to 40 Pa.C.S. Ch. 61
15	(relating to hospital plan corporations) or 63 (relating to

17	Section 8. The State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and
18	Family Therapists and Professional Counselors shall promulgate
19	regulations as necessary to implement this act no later than 90
20	days from the effective date of this section.
21	Section 9. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
