AN ACT

1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the  
2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further  
3 providing for modification or revocation of order of  
4 probation and for court-imposed sanctions for offenders  
5 violating probation.

6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania  
7 hereby enacts as follows:

8 Section 1. Sections 9771(b) and 9771.1(i)(2) of Title 42 of  
9 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:

10 § 9771. Modification or revocation of order of probation.

12 (b) Revocation.--The court may revoke an order of probation  
13 upon proof of the violation of specified conditions of the  
14 probation. Upon revocation the sentencing alternatives available  
15 to the court shall be the same as were available at the time of  
16 initial sentencing, due consideration being given to the time  
17 spent serving the order of probation. A term of imprisonment  
18 upon revocation of an order of probation under this section  
19 shall not exceed six months.

2 § 9771.1. Court-imposed sanctions for offenders violating  
3 probation.

5 (i) Revocation of probation.--

7 (2) Upon revocation, the sentencing alternatives shall  
8 be the same as were available at the time of initial  
9 sentencing, due consideration being given to the time spent  
10 serving the order of probation. A term of imprisonment upon  
11 revocation of an order of probation under this subsection  
12 shall not exceed six months.

14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
