- 1 Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sentencing, further
- 3 providing for modification or revocation of order of
- 4 probation and for court-imposed sanctions for offenders
- 5 violating probation.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. Sections 9771(b) and 9771.1(i)(2) of Title 42 of
- 9 the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read:
- 10 § 9771. Modification or revocation of order of probation.

- 12 (b) Revocation. -- The court may revoke an order of probation
- 13 upon proof of the violation of specified conditions of the
- 14 probation. Upon revocation the sentencing alternatives available
- 15 to the court shall be the same as were available at the time of
- 16 initial sentencing, due consideration being given to the time
- 17 spent serving the order of probation. A term of imprisonment
- 18 upon revocation of an order of probation under this section
- 19 shall not exceed six months.

- 5 (i) Revocation of probation.--
- 6 * * *
- 7 (2) Upon revocation, the sentencing alternatives shall
- 8 be the same as were available at the time of initial
- 9 sentencing, due consideration being given to the time spent
- serving the order of probation. <u>A term of imprisonment upon</u>
- 11 <u>revocation of an order of probation under this subsection</u>
- 12 <u>shall not exceed six months.</u>
