## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in motor carrier safety, repealing provisions relating to findings and declaration of policy and further providing for definitions and for Motor Carrier Safety Advisory Committee.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. Section 7802 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania
9	Consolidated Statutes is repealed:
10	[§ 7802. Findings and declaration of policy.
11	(a) Findings It is hereby determined and declared as a
12	matter of legislative findings that:
13	(1) The operation of the motor carrier industry is a
14	vital part of the economic health of this Commonwealth by
15	providing needed goods and services as well as job
16	opportunities for many Pennsylvanians.
17	(2) As more and more motor carriers share the road with
18	other vehicles, public safety concerns continue to rise. The
19	latest statistics from the National Highway Traffic Safety

- Administration indicate that on a national level, while
- trucks represent only 3% of vehicles on the road, they were
- involved in 13% of highway deaths in 1997 alone, and in the
- same year 444,000 large trucks were involved in crashes,
- 5 killing 5,355 persons and injuring 133,000 more.
- 6 (3) In order to promote the safety of this
- 7 Commonwealth's highways and to best safeguard Pennsylvania
- 8 residents and their property, it is essential to provide
- 9 guidelines to ensure that motor carriers conduct their
- operations in a safe, responsible and professional manner.
- 11 (b) Declaration of policy. -- The purpose of this chapter is
- 12 to promote the safe, responsible and professional operation of
- 13 motor carriers within this Commonwealth.]
- 14 Section 2. Section 7803 of Title 75 is amended by adding a
- 15 definition to read:
- 16 § 7803. Definitions.
- 17 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 18 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 19 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 20 \* \* \*
- 21 "Motor carrier safety." The safe movement of an individual
- 22 or goods on trafficways HIGHWAYS that are transported by
- 23 <u>commercial motor vehicles as defined in section 1603 (relating</u>

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- 24 to definitions).
- 25 Section 3. Section 7804 of Title 75 is amended to read:
- 26 § 7804. Motor Carrier Safety Advisory Committee.
- 27 (a) Creation. -- There is hereby created a Motor Carrier
- 28 Safety Advisory Committee which shall consist of the following
- 29 [28] <u>30</u> <u>31</u> members:
- 30 (1) The Secretary of Transportation.

1	(2) The Chairman of the Pennsylvania Public Utility
2	Commission.
3	(3) The Chairman of the Pennsylvania Turnpike
4	Commission.
5	(4) The Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police.
6	(5) The Chairman and Minority Chairman of the
7	Transportation Committee of the Senate.
8	(6) The Chairman and Minority Chairman of the
9	Transportation Committee of the House of Representatives.
10	(7) [Twenty] <del>Twenty two</del> TWENTY-THREE members of the <
11	public representing the areas of concern specified who shall
12	have extensive experience and knowledge of motor carrier
13	transportation and safety activities throughout this
14	Commonwealth, to be appointed by the Governor as follows:
15	(i) One representative from the Pennsylvania Chamber
16	of Business and Industry.
17	(ii) One representative from the Pennsylvania Chiefs
18	of Police Association.
19	(iii) One representative from the Special Court
20	Judges Association of Pennsylvania.
21	(iv) Two persons representing the interests of
22	independent truckers.
23	(v) Two representatives from the Pennsylvania Motor
24	Truck Association.
25	(vi) [Two representatives from the Pennsylvania
26	Truck Transportation Alliance] One representative from
27	the Pennsylvania Manufactured Housing Association.
28	(vii) One representative from the Pennsylvania AAA
29	Federation.
30	(viii) One representative from the Pennsylvania

1	Public Transportation Association.
2	(ix) One representative from the Pennsylvania Bus
3	Association.
4	(x) One representative from the Pennsylvania School
5	Bus Association.
6	(xi) One representative from the [Hardwood Lumber
7	Manufacturers Association of Pennsylvania] Pennsylvania
8	Forest Products Association.
9	(xii) One person representing the interests of motor
10	carrier drivers.
11	(xiii) One person representing the interests of
12	bulk haulers.
13	(xiv) One representative from the moving and storage
14	industry in Pennsylvania.
15	(xv) One representative from the petroleum industry
16	in Pennsylvania.]
17	(xvi) One representative from [a Class I Railroad]
18	the railroad industry in Pennsylvania.
19	(xvii) One person representing the interests of
20	local government.
21	(xviii) One person representing the interests of the
22	motor carrier manufacturing industry.
23	(xix) Five SIX representatives from the transport <
24	industry, each representing one of the following areas:
25	(A) Bulk products.
26	(B) Moving and storage.
27	(C) Petroleum.
28	(D) Marcellus Shale NATURAL gas.
29	(E) Coal.
30	(F) CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL TRANSPORTATION.

- 1 (a.1) Specific vacancy. -- If a position or vacancy under
- 2 subsection (a) (7) is not filled by the appointing authority
- 3 within 120 days of the opening or vacancy, the appointment shall
- 4 <u>be made by the President pro tempore of the Senate.</u>
- 5 (b) [Chairperson.--The Governor shall appoint one member of
- 6 the committee as chairperson.] Officers.--The members of the
- 7 committee shall annually elect a <a href="mailto:chairperson">chairperson</a>, <--
- 8 a secretary and a treasurer] AND SECRETARY from among the public <--
- 9 members appointed to the committee.
- 10 (c) Designees. -- Each member appointed under subsection (a)
- 11 <u>(1), (2), (3), (4), (5) and (6)</u> may designate a representative
- 12 to serve in his or her stead. A member who designates a
- 13 representative shall notify the chairperson in writing of the
- 14 designation.
- 15 (d) Terms of appointees. -- The terms of all members of the
- 16 committee appointed by the Governor shall be for three years.
- 17 Any member of the committee may be reappointed for an additional
- 18 term or terms. [Any person appointed to fill a vacancy shall
- 19 serve only for the unexpired term.] Each member shall serve <--

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- 20 until the appointment of a successor.
- 21 (e) Meetings and expenses. --
- 22 (1) The committee shall meet at least four times every
- 23 12 months but may hold such additional meetings as are called
- 24 by the chairperson or by petition of at least six committee
- 25 members.
- 26 (1.1) The chairperson shall provide notice at least 14
- 27 days in advance for regular meetings and shall provide a
- 28 minimum of three days' notice for special meetings.
- 29  $\underline{(1.2)}$  A majority of the members shall constitute a
- 30 quorum for the conduct of business. The secretary shall

- 1 maintain a record of meeting attendance by members and shall
- 2 provide written notice to appointed members who miss [two]
- 3 <u>three</u> consecutive meetings. [Three] <u>Four</u> consecutive
- 4 committee meeting absences by an appointed member shall be
- 5 grounds for removal if affirmed by a majority vote of the
- 6 committee.
- 7 (2) Minutes of meetings shall be prepared by the
- 8 secretary and filed with the committee and distributed to all
- 9 members. All records shall be a matter of public record.
- 10 (3) The public members of the committee shall be allowed
- 11 actual, necessary and reasonable per diem expenses in
- 12 accordance with regulations of the Executive Board. The
- department shall provide appropriate staff support to enable
- 14 the committee to properly carry out its function.
- 15 (f) Powers and duties. -- The committee shall have the power
- 16 and duty to assess, evaluate and recommend standards for the
- 17 safe operation of motor carriers in this Commonwealth,
- 18 including, but not limited to, the following objectives:
- [(1) Develop continuing education programs for first-
- year and second-year CDL drivers and consider incentive
- 21 programs for drivers who undergo incremental safety training
- and testing throughout their driving careers.
- 23 (2) Examine ways in which to increase and document motor
- carrier use of the Pennsylvania Turnpike, including the
- possibility of a fuel tax rebate or other incentives.
- 26 (3) Study the feasibility of utilizing existing and
- developing technology relative to the electronic control
- mechanisms of motor carriers to aid in the enforcement of
- speed limits.
- 30 (4) Develop a policy to address the dissemination of

1	information among employers of CDL drivers relative to
2	employee job performance and conduct in order to best protect
3	the public from unsafe drivers.
4	(5) Analyze the feasibility of instituting enhanced
5	penalties for motor carrier moving violations and of
6	utilizing the amount of the increase as a dedicated source of
7	funding for the construction of security walls.
8	(6) Provide a forum for the exchange of information on
9	the problems associated with travel as passenger vehicles,
10	motorcycles and motor carriers share the road systems and
11	consider education initiatives aimed at the motoring public
12	as well as the motor carrier industry.
13	(7) Consider any other issue raised in relation to motor
14	carrier operation and road safety that may arise from time to
15	time.]
16	(8) Study the feasibility of improving highway safety
17	and freight transportation on trafficways HIGHWAYS and
18	develop a policy periodically on the most pressing issues
19	facing motor carrier safety.
20	(9) Examine and recommend motor carrier safety
21	initiatives for strategic plans of the department, the
22	Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and the Pennsylvania
23	State Police.
24	(10) Advise and comment on all phases of motor carrier
25	safety activities being undertaken or financially assisted by
26	the department and agencies of the Commonwealth.
27	(11) With assistance from the department, provide advice
28	and recommendations to businesses, manufacturers, educational
29	institutions, technology developers, the motor carrier
30	industry, labor communities and local governments related to

- 2 (12) Develop and maintain a forum for the exchange of
- 3 <u>ideas, needs, objectives, plans and accomplishments related</u>
- 4 <u>to motor carrier safety.</u>
- 5 (g) Reports. -- The committee shall submit annual reports of
- 6 its deliberations, conclusions and [suggestions] recommendations
- 7 to the Governor [and], the Secretary of Transportation and
- 8 members of the General Assembly.
- 9 Section 4. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
