- 28 [§ 7802. Findings and declaration of policy.
- 29 (a) Findings. -- It is hereby determined and declared as a
- 30 matter of legislative findings that:

- 1 (1) The operation of the motor carrier industry is a
- vital part of the economic health of this Commonwealth by
- providing needed goods and services as well as job
- 4 opportunities for many Pennsylvanians.
- 5 (2) As more and more motor carriers share the road with
- other vehicles, public safety concerns continue to rise. The
- 7 latest statistics from the National Highway Traffic Safety
- 8 Administration indicate that on a national level, while
- 9 trucks represent only 3% of vehicles on the road, they were
- involved in 13% of highway deaths in 1997 alone, and in the
- same year 444,000 large trucks were involved in crashes,
- killing 5,355 persons and injuring 133,000 more.
- 13 (3) In order to promote the safety of this
- 14 Commonwealth's highways and to best safeguard Pennsylvania
- residents and their property, it is essential to provide
- quidelines to ensure that motor carriers conduct their
- operations in a safe, responsible and professional manner.
- 18 (b) Declaration of policy. -- The purpose of this chapter is
- 19 to promote the safe, responsible and professional operation of
- 20 motor carriers within this Commonwealth.]

- 3 (a) Creation. -- There is hereby created a Motor Carrier
- 4 Safety Advisory Committee which shall consist of the following

- 6 (1) The Secretary of Transportation.
- 7 (2) The Chairman of the Pennsylvania Public Utility
- 8 Commission.
- 9 (3) The Chairman of the Pennsylvania Turnpike
- 10 Commission.
- 11 (4) The Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police.
- 12 (5) The Chairman and Minority Chairman of the
- 13 Transportation Committee of the Senate.
- 14 (6) The Chairman and Minority Chairman of the

- 11 (b) [Chairperson.--The Governor shall appoint one member of

- 14 a secretary and a treasurer] and secretary from among the public
- 15 members appointed to the committee.
- 16 (c) Designees. -- Each member appointed under subsection (a)
- 17 <u>(1), (2), (3), (4), (5) and (6)</u> may designate a representative
- 18 to serve in his or her stead. A member who designates a
- 19 representative shall notify the chairperson in writing of the

- 21 (d) Terms of appointees. -- The terms of all members of the
- 22 committee appointed by the Governor shall be for three years.
- 23 Any member of the committee may be reappointed for an additional
- 24 term or terms. [Any person appointed to fill a vacancy shall
- 25 serve only for the unexpired term.] Each member shall serve
- 26 until the appointment of a successor.
- (e) Meetings and expenses.--
- 28 (1) The committee shall meet at least four times every
- 29 12 months but may hold such additional meetings as are called
- 30 by the chairperson or by petition of at least six committee

1 members.

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- 2 (1.1) The chairperson shall provide notice at least 14
 3 days in advance for regular meetings and shall provide a
 4 minimum of three days' notice for special meetings.
 - (1.2) A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of business. The secretary shall maintain a record of meeting attendance by members and shall provide written notice to appointed members who miss [two] three consecutive meetings. [Three] Four consecutive committee meeting absences by an appointed member shall be grounds for removal if affirmed by a majority vote of the committee.
 - (2) Minutes of meetings shall be prepared by the secretary and filed with the committee and distributed to all members. All records shall be a matter of public record.
 - (3) The public members of the committee shall be allowed actual, necessary and reasonable per diem expenses in accordance with regulations of the Executive Board. The department shall provide appropriate staff support to enable the committee to properly carry out its function.
- 21 (f) Powers and duties.—The committee shall have the power 22 and duty to assess, evaluate and recommend standards for the 23 safe operation of motor carriers in this Commonwealth, 24 including, but not limited to, the following objectives:
- [(1) Develop continuing education programs for firstyear and second-year CDL drivers and consider incentive programs for drivers who undergo incremental safety training and testing throughout their driving careers.
- (2) Examine ways in which to increase and document motor carrier use of the Pennsylvania Turnpike, including the

1 possibility of a fuel tax rebate or other incentives.

(3) Study the feasibility of utilizing existing and developing technology relative to the electronic control mechanisms of motor carriers to aid in the enforcement of speed limits.

- (4) Develop a policy to address the dissemination of information among employers of CDL drivers relative to employee job performance and conduct in order to best protect the public from unsafe drivers.
- (5) Analyze the feasibility of instituting enhanced penalties for motor carrier moving violations and of utilizing the amount of the increase as a dedicated source of funding for the construction of security walls.
- (6) Provide a forum for the exchange of information on the problems associated with travel as passenger vehicles, motorcycles and motor carriers share the road systems and consider education initiatives aimed at the motoring public as well as the motor carrier industry.
- (7) Consider any other issue raised in relation to motor carrier operation and road safety that may arise from time to time.]
- (8) Study the feasibility of improving highway safety and freight transportation on highways and develop a policy periodically on the most pressing issues facing motor carrier safety.
- (9) Examine and recommend motor carrier safety
 initiatives for strategic plans of the department, the
 Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission and the Pennsylvania
 State Police.
- 30 (10) Advise and comment on all phases of motor carrier

- 1 <u>safety activities being undertaken or financially assisted by</u>
- 2 <u>the department and agencies of the Commonwealth.</u>
- 3 (11) With assistance from the department, provide advice
- 4 <u>and recommendations to businesses, manufacturers, educational</u>
- 5 <u>institutions</u>, technology developers, the motor carrier
- 6 <u>industry</u>, <u>labor communities and local governments related to</u>
- 7 <u>motor carrier safety.</u>
- 8 (12) Develop and maintain a forum for the exchange of
- 9 <u>ideas, needs, objectives, plans and accomplishments related</u>
- to motor carrier safety.
- 11 (g) Reports. -- The committee shall submit annual reports of
- 12 its deliberations, conclusions and [suggestions] recommendations
- 13 to the Governor [and], the Secretary of Transportation and
- 14 members of the General Assembly.
