AN ACT

Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania 1 Consolidated Statutes, further providing for military family 2 relief assistance. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 4 5 hereby enacts as follows: 6 Section 1. Section 7319(b)(2) introductory paragraph and (iii), (c)(2), (f), (h) and the definition of "eligible service member" in subsection (j) of Title 51 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended to read: 10 § 7319. Military family relief assistance. 11 12 (b) Administration of program. --* * * 13 14 The Military Family Relief Assistance Program is 15 established. Contributions and appropriations received for 16 the fund shall be distributed by the department under the 17 program to eligible service members and eligible relatives of 1 eligible service members. Applicants must demonstrate to the

2 department that they have a direct and immediate financial

3 need as a result of the military service of the service

4 member. Such circumstances must be beyond the control of and

5 not as a result of misconduct by the service member. The

applicant shall demonstrate that the financial need is caused

by one or more of the following:

9 The wounding of the service member in the line (iii) 10 of duty sustained as a result of combat or attack 11 resulting in an immediate need for funds for travel, 12 lodging, subsistence or other activities directly related 13 to the casualty for which the applicant lacks financial 14 resources. [No more than two eligible relatives of an 15 eliqible service member may receive assistance under this 16 subparagraph.]

- 18 (c) Guidelines.--The department shall, in consultation with
- 19 the chairman and minority chairman of the Appropriations
- 20 Committee of the Senate, the chairman and minority chairman of
- 21 the Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives,
- 22 the chairman and minority chairman of the Veterans Affairs and
- 23 Emergency Preparedness Committee of the Senate and the chairman
- 24 and minority chairman of the Veterans Affairs and Emergency
- 25 Preparedness Committee of the House of Representatives, develop
- 26 guidelines necessary to administer the provisions of this
- 27 section. The guidelines established under this subsection shall

- 30 (2) Set forth the maximum amount of relief and the

- 16 (j) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 17 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 18 subsection:

- "Eligible service member."
- 21 (1) Any of the following:
- 22 (i) A member of the armed forces of the United
- 23 States or its reserve components, including the
- Pennsylvania National Guard, who is serving on active
- 25 duty other than active duty for training for a period of
- 30 or more consecutive days.
- 27 (ii) A member of the Pennsylvania National Guard
- serving on State active duty for a period of 30 or more
- 29 consecutive days.
- 30 (iii) A member in good standing of any reserve

component of the armed forces of the United States, including the Pennsylvania National Guard, for a period of [one year] two years after release from a tour of active duty, other than active duty for training, or State active duty of 30 or more consecutive days' duration when the need for assistance is directly related to the member's performance of active duty or State active duty.

- (iv) A former member of the armed forces of the
 United States or its reserve components, including the
 Pennsylvania National Guard, for a period of [two] four
 years after discharge if:
 - (A) The member was discharged for medical reasons arising out of the member's military service.
 - (B) The medical disability that resulted in the member's discharge was incurred in the line of duty and was not the result of misconduct.
 - (C) The medical condition giving rise to the discharge did not exist prior to the member entering military service.
 - (D) The medical disability was incurred while the member was serving on active duty, other than active duty for training, or State active duty for a period of 30 or more consecutive days.
 - (E) The former member received an honorable discharge for medical reasons.
 - (F) The need for assistance is directly related to the former member's military service or the disability incurred as a result of the military service.

- 1 (2) An eligible service member must be a resident of
- 2 Pennsylvania at the time of the application for assistance.

- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
