## AN ACT

1 2 3	Amending Title 35 (Health and Safety) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Commonwealth services, providing for employee classification and regulations.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 35 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	§ 7309. Employee classification and regulations.
9	(a) ApplicabilityThis section shall apply during the
10	period of a declaration by the Governor of a disaster emergency
11	<u>under section 7301(c) (relating to general authority of</u>
12	Governor) and notwithstanding any other provision of law.
13	(b) Employee classification
14	(1) The Governor shall classify which employees under
15	the Governor's jurisdiction are engaged in life-sustaining
16	work.
17	(2) The head of each State agency not under the
18	Governor's direct jurisdiction shall classify which employees

1	are engaged in life-sustaining work.
2	(c) RegulationsThe following are prohibited, unless the
3	action is directly related to responding to the disaster
4	<u>emergency or adhering to a Federal or State statutory timeline</u>
5	<u>or court order:</u>
6	(1) Consideration, adoption or publication within the
7	Pennsylvania Bulletin of a proposed regulation, a final-form
8	regulation or a final-omitted regulation subject to the act
9	of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory
10	Review Act.
11	(2) Conducting a department or agency advisory committee
12	meeting.
13	(d) Waiver
14	(1) A Commonwealth agency may petition to the
15	appropriate standing committees of the Senate and House of
16	Representatives under section 7(d) of the Regulatory Review
17	Act for a waiver of the prohibition under subsection (c). The
18	petition must:
19	<u>(i) be in writing;</u>
20	(ii) be signed by the head of the Commonwealth
21	agency or its governing body;
22	(iii) state the compelling reason why a waiver
23	should be granted; and
24	(iv) be submitted to the chair of each standing
25	committee for distribution to the respective members of
26	the committee.
27	(2) A waiver under paragraph (1) shall be granted upon a
28	majority vote of each standing committee.
29	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
